

COLLECTION OF OLD PALMS

Every year, palms from the previous Holy Week are used to make ashes for Ash Wednesday. You can deposit your old palms in the baskets available at both entrances to church. Please note that palms will not be collected any later than next Sunday.

SHROVE TUESDAY PANCAKE PARTY February 21st after the Forty Hours

The last three days of Septuagesima (from Quinquagesima Sunday to the day before Ash Wednesday) are sometimes known "Shrovetide," after an archaic word for absolution (e.g., to shrive, to be shriven), since people would try to start off Lent on the right foot by going to confession right beforehand. The final day before Lent is thus called Shrove Tuesday. Since the approach of Lent, however, does not exclude a certain mirth before the start of the 40-day fast, this day is also known as "Fat Tuesday" (hence the well-known Mardi Gras in French, or its equivalent in other languages). It was also known as "Pancake Day," and the idea in all these cases was that it was the last chance to use up fatty ingredients like butter (since not only meat but all animal products were formerly forbidden during Lent). Whether you want to make American-style thick pancakes or thin crepes with various fillings, or indeed prefer other pre-Lenten treats, please join us in the church hall for a potluck celebration after the conclusion of the Forty Hours on Shrove Tuesday!

Saturday, February 18th - Altar Boy Meeting & Outing



Before Lent begins, there will be an outing with the altar boys (and their fathers) to thank them for their dedication throughout the year. After the 7:45 a.m. Mass, there will be a light breakfast in the church hall, then server training for the Forty Hours. We will then head out to a local bowling alley and finish with a pizza lunch. Please make sure to respond to Canon by Wednesday so that we may make reservations for the correct number.

If this is your first time here, we look forward to meeting you. We hope you will be able to join us for our next monthly social. If you are interested in registering as a parishioner, forms are available at both entrances.

Holy Mass and all the sacraments at Saints Cyril & Methodius Oratory are celebrated in the traditional Latin Rite. This form of worship, which developed many centuries ago, is a priceless treasure of our Catholic faith. On Sundays and feasts, there are handouts containing English translations of the Propers (the prayers and readings proper to the day). If you are unfamiliar with the traditional Latin Mass, please do not hesitate to approach the clergy of the Oratory with any questions you may have. The pastoral care of the Oratory has been entrusted by the Bishop of Bridgeport to the clergy of the Institute of Christ the King, a Catholic priestly society founded in 1990 and currently ministering in dioceses across the United States, Europe and Africa.

Holy communion may be received by practicing Catholics in the state of grace. In the traditional Roman Rite, holy communion is received kneeling at the communion rail (unless you are impaired from doing so) and directly on the tongue. The mouth should be open with the tongue slightly extended. You do not reply when the priest places the host in your mouth. The sacrament of confession is available every day 30 minutes before the start of Mass (ending approximately 5 minutes before Mass begins).

The church narthex (vestibule) functions as a cry room during Mass. As a courtesy to others, please feel free to make use of it when you have a crying child by exiting quietly down one of the side aisles. Please hold all conversations outside.

Out of respect for God's house, please bear in mind the importance of modest and decent attire. Ladies who wish to do so may borrow a veil to wear at Mass (available in baskets by the entrances).

If you are not a Catholic, you are warmly invited to learn more about our faith. The Catholic Church was founded 2000 years ago by Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ to carry on His work for the salvation of souls. If you are interested in becoming Catholic or simply want to learn more about the Catholic faith, please do not hesitate to contact us. The Oratory offers individual instruction. We look forward to hearing from you.

Sacrament beginning each day after Mass, and Benediction at 6:00 p.m. We will only be able to do this if at least two people are willing to commit to at least one hour of Adoration during these times. Thank you to all those who have signed up: please make sure to double check your time slots and to be present at those times. Of course, you can also show

up at other times as well (especially if you cannot commit to an hour at a time) and feel free to invite friends from other parishes.

Confessions will be available at 5:00 p.m. each day.
