Am I really a witness of the Resurrection?

During this Eastertide the Church is joyful because Christ is risen and He has redeemed us. Since the luminous night of Easter, the Paschal candle, the symbol of the risen Christ, shines in the sanctuary of the church. Its flame has been transmitted to the soul of every baptized person.

During forty days the Apostles have been in touch with the mystery of the timeless presence of the Risen Christ but they do not understand yet that the Kingdom of God must start inside themselves in

order to be realized through eternity. Jesus is preparing them for what is going to follow: He is going to leave and He tells them about it. His departure will not result in an absence but in a new kind of presence.

Easter morning has been a day of triumph and of glory. But this triumph is humble. From the beginning, the good news of the Resurrection is transmitted only through witness. The font of all is the burning love of Jesus' heart, pierced by the spear. Jesus wants witnesses because He wants to associate us to His saving work. If He had not done that, we would be unable to understand the meaning of human life.

Jesus' love for the world is a burning love. The Paschal candle reminds us of that mysterious reality. On Easter night we did not light the candle by saying: "switch yourself on". The Easter fire was needed. It is the duty of the witness to transmit. We must never forget that we move the world forward only if we ourselves move forward. Jesus will be loved if we ourselves love Him.

If you happen to be discouraged by life, come back to the source and ask yourself this question: "Am I really a witness of the Resurrection?" From the answer to that question you will be suddenly reminded that only Christ can fill your heart.

Sts. Cletus & Marcellinus Noon & 6:00 p.m. Mass

St. Cletus (1st c.) and St. Marcellinus (3rd c.) were both Romans, popes, and martyrs who ruled the Holy See during the terrible persecution of Christians at the hands of the Roman Empire. St. Cletus was a convert and disciple of St. Peter the Apostle who became the third Bishop of Rome from 76 to 89 A.D., under the reigns of Roman Emperors Vespasian and Titus His name appears in the Roman Canon of the Mass. St. Marcellinus was the twenty-ninth Bishop of Rome from 296 to 304 A.D. during the infamous persecution of the Roman Emperor Diocletian, on the eve of the legalization of Christianity across the Empire. Statues of these two popes of the early Church sit on opposite corners of the portico ceiling of Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome. They share a feast day on April 26th.

MAY CROWNING & PROCESSION Sunday, May 12

The May crowning will take place at 9:15 am and Immediately following *(weather permitting)* we will have a Rosary Procession around the St. Patrick's church neighborhood.

At 9:10 a.m. the girls age 5 and older who will carry baskets of flower petals should meet in the vestibule where someone will hand them their baskets and give them instructions.



May Crowning song sheets will be available in the rear of the church for use during the procession.

Our crowned Lady will be carried throughout the entire procession.



The Procession is led by the Altar Servers with the processional Crucifix, followed by the girls with baskets of flower petals to scatter along the way. Next in the procession will be the men carrying the statue of Our Blessed Mother.

The Ceremony concludes with the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary.


