#### Dear faithful,

The miracle commemorated in the Gospel of this Second Sunday of Lent must have been for the Apostles one of the most stunning they had ever witnessed in all their time with Our Lord:


"This transfiguration of the Son of Man, this manifestation of his glory, lasted but a few moments; his mission was not on Thabor; it was humiliation and suffering in Jerusalem. He therefore withdrew into himself the brightness he had allowed to transpire; and when he came to the three Apostles, who, on hearing the voice from the cloud, had fallen on their faces with fear — they could see no one save only Jesus.

The bright cloud was gone; Moses and Elias had disappeared. What a favor they have had bestowed upon them! Will they remember what they have seen and heard? They have had such a revelation of the Divinity of their dear Master! Is it possible that when the hour of trial comes, they will forget it and doubt his being God? and when they see him suffer and die, be ashamed of him and deny him? Alas! the Gospel has told us what happened to them" (*The Liturgical Year*, by Dom Prosper Guéranger).

We have all had moments of signal graces in our lives, when the favor worked for us by God is so unexpected yet at just the right moment, and just what we needed in that moment. The remembrance of such a grace constitutes for us a pledge of God's abiding presence in our lives through prosperity and adversity, as the Transfiguration would have for Peter, James and John during the bitterness of Our Lord's Passion. Throughout the rest of this Lenten season, therefore, let us remember: God will not leave our side in the midst of the cross, so let us carry it bravely. Please God, it will prepare the way for our resurrection.

# † Canon Henrique Fragelli, RIP

A letter from Msgr. Gilles Wach, Prior General:

Dear Friends of the Institute,

On this first day of the month of March, dedicated to St. Joseph, patron saint of a good death, it is with great sadness that we inform you that Canon Henrique Fragelli passed away early this morning in Brazil at the age of 59 years after suffering from a pulmonary infection.

Ordained to the priesthood on July 3, 2008 by His Eminence Cardinal Raymond Leo Burke, he exercised his priestly ministry in Wausau, in the diocese of La Crosse, then in Oakland and finally in Mouila

(Gabon). Through his tireless work and great zeal, he was able to give new life to our mission in Mouila. He established a school, a dispensary and an orphanage.

Having contracted Covid in the spring of 2021, he had to be hospitalized for a long time. Many of you prayed for his recovery. After his miraculous recovery, his health became very fragile.

Deeply grateful for the spiritual support you have generously offered him, I now ask you to pray for the repose of his priestly soul. May he who gave his life in the service of Holy Mother Church within the family of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest now receive the eternal reward promised to those who labor in the vineyard of Our Blessed Lord. I also entrust the family of Canon Fragelli to your prayers in this time of sorrow, as well as all those who are afflicted by his passing.

Throughout this holy season of Lent, may our Mother of Sorrows strengthen us all in the hope of the Resurrection of her divine Son and in the joyful expectation of the heavenly life to come. *Requiescat in pace.*
