Daylight Saving Time begins today: Turn your clock forward!

Dear faithful,

The Mass readings from Monday in the Third Week of Lent, which we are now beginning, feature one of the most tender acts of God's mercy toward a sinner, and even a pagan, of the Old Testament. The Fourth Book of Kings (chapter 5;1-15) shows us the Syrian general, Naaman, afflicted by that all-too-common and deadly disease of the ancient world, leprosy, which gradually destroyed the person's skin and left ghastly lesions on the body.

When the prophet of God, Eliseus, is sent to Naaman though and tells him that God will heal him if he washes seven times in the river Jordan, what is Naaman's reaction? Gratitude? Relief? Anything but! In his pride, the thought of doing something so simple and yet receiving such a great reward is somehow repugnant to him. Thankfully, he comes to his senses when rebuked by his servants, and he complies with the instructions of Eliseus. His skin is made clean and new, and this wondrous event leads to his conversion to the Faith of Israel. May we always remember – our greatest gifts are not our works and merits, but the free and unmerited gifts of God: above all, His mercy for us poor sinners.

Alas, the weather has not been kind to our plan for a Father-Son Flag Football game for the Altar Server Corps, and then to boot I was a bit under the weather for more than a week.
