Dear faithful,

Lent goes by too fast! I hope you've mortified yourselves. We've got two weeks to finish strong! Amazingly, we have already arrived at Passion Sunday. Like every year, the crucifix and statues of Our Lord, as well as of our intimate friends, the saints, have been veiled in penitential violet. As Our Lord knew isolation from His closest friends during His Passion, so shall we have a taste of this bitter gall.

This is the day on which, as Scripture puts it, "Jesus hid himself" (John 8;59). He left the temple and went out of reach of the Pharisees and those under their influence at this time, because it was not yet His time to lay down His life for us. This act can also be seen, however, as an echo of the Prophet Isaiah: "Verily thou art a hidden God, the God of Israel the saviour" (45;15).

Has Our Lord's relationship with us fundamentally changed in the last two thousand years? No. Most of the time, He remains "hidden" from us, that is, not visible to our earthly eyes. He remains before us at all times however in His Eucharistic Presence, behind the doors of the tabernacle. This is where He is calling us to come and commune with Him intimately and silently. This is where He will restore grace to our wearied souls.

St. Margaret Mary Parish will have a **Forty Hours Devotion** beginning at 6 pm this **Thursday, March** 30 - **Saturday, April** 1. Confessions will be heard from 6:30 - 8:30 pm on Thursday evening.
