Dear faithful,

"Be ye doers of the Word, and not hearers only." Saint James the Apostle reminds us this Sunday that we are not called to an idle faith, a faith of pure sentiment which remains inert and unable to propel us to do the will of God. The faith which saves, rather, is a faith which produces in us good works. Principally, this means the works we're obliged to carry out by our state in life – to be good fathers and mothers, to be willing to make sacrifices of our time for our neighbors in need, to provide for our families.

What about the spiritual and corporal works of mercy, those salutary lists we find, among other places, in our hand missals? If we look around us, we may see that the opportunities are not as rare as they seem. Firstly, we can always pray more, and indeed we neglect many opportunities. Even within our own parish community, there may be those who could benefit from our aid, for example, simple errands for those who are aging and not as easily able to get out and about anymore.

Finally, we must remember that we are called to persevere in good works amidst the many tribulations of this life, as Our Lord persevered in dying for us on the Cross, even to the point where He could no longer breathe. It is not without reason that the cross often weighs more heavily on our shoulders as the years go on. Though painful, and tiring, this is the sign that God is preparing a place for us in Heaven, where He will finally wipe every tear from our eyes forever. Persevere!

The first time we receive the real and substantial presence of Our Lord in Holy Communion is a truly extraordinary moment in our lives; one filled with untold graces. I am sure these young children were well disposed by all your efforts and prayers. and Rogation Processions. The Rogation Processions are an ancient tradition going back centuries and originating in France. They have as their object to implore God's mercy and protection from natural disasters, such as earthquakes, floods and lightning. With the ongoing breakdown in society and increasing violence and disorder, it would seem we have a special need of these processions now. Accordingly, this Tuesday, May 16 at 6 pm, we will have a short Rogation Procession around the block, followed by Low Mass.

This <u>Thursday</u>, <u>May 18</u> is the Feast of the <u>Ascension</u>, one of the most ancient and solemn feasts of the entire liturgical year. All who are able are encouraged to attend Holy Mass on this day. There will be the usual Low Mass at 12 pm with organ. At St. Edward's Parish in Newark, at 7 pm, there will be a Solemn Mass. Our good friend Fr. Robert McTeigue, SJ will celebrate, and I will serve as deacon.
