Dear faithful.

On this Eight Sunday after Pentecost, Saint Paul, as if anticipating our "summer slide," has a word of warning for us:

"Brethren: We are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh; for if you live according to the flesh, you shall die; but if by the Spirit you mortify the deeds of the flesh, you shall live" (Rom. 8;12-17).

Lent is now several months behind us, and there remains more than half a year until the penitential season returns. Nevertheless, we always do well to remember the spirit of mortification throughout the entire year. Indeed, an increase in the love of mortification is the petition of the Second Sorrowful Mystery of the Rosary, the Scourging of Jesus at the Pillar, recited every Tuesday and Friday.

Let us keep up always and to a certain extent our penances and mortifications, principally those of the heart. The best mortification is the patient and loving acceptance, on a daily basis, of the small crosses and contradictions of our lives.

A big thank you to all the dedicated volunteers who made <u>Canon Wells'</u> <u>First Solemn Mass</u> such a special occasion last Sunday. The day was crowned by Canon Talarico's presentation of the letter granting a <u>plenary</u> <u>indulgence</u> to all present for the Mass, which had been graciously conceded in the weeks prior by Cardinal Piacenza, the head of the Apostolic Penitentiary in Rome. Let us <u>continue to pray</u> for our Oakland seminarians, Abbé Alex Hoopes and Abbé Cody Teague, as well as the other seminarians who came to help on Sunday. Present were Abbé Torreano, from the Institute's San Jose Apostolate, Immaculate Heart of Mary Oratory, and Abbé Nixon (he's not a crook!), who generously flew up from southern California to serve as Master of Ceremonies for the Mass.

California, and in particular the Oakland Apostolate, seems to be quite the vocations producer for our dear Institute! I'm convinced that a big part of this is the continued generosity in prayer and sufferings offered up on the part of our faithful here. You see it – <u>your sacrifices have an effect</u>!
