Dear faithful,

The healing which Our Lord works for the deaf and dumb man in this Sunday's Gospel is rich with symbolism, as explained by Dom Prosper Guéranger in *The Liturgical Year*. A few of the more important themes are separation from the world, and the firmness of God's grace:

"...When the deaf and dumb man was brought before Him, He took him apart — apart, so to say, from the multitude of the noisy passions and the vain thoughts which had made him deaf to heavenly truths. After all, would there be much good in curing him if the occasion of his malady were not removed, and he were to relapse perhaps that same day?"

We have countless times received God's mercy, first and foremost in the Sacrament of Confession. We know, however, that if we do not let Our Lord take us apart from this world and its temptations by fleeing the near occasion of sin, this constitutes an act of presumption. Our negligence and pride will get the better of us if we cannot make this sacrifice, and we will fall into the same sins. Let us imitate the man whom Our Lord healed in cultivating assiduously the spirit of separation from the world.

We extend a big "Thank you" to <u>Abbé Cody Teague</u>, who after spending several weeks of vacation with us has now left for Wisconsin, where he will continue to help with an Institute summer camp. He will then return to Gricigliano for his next year of seminary. Abbé Teague provided much help at this year's St. Michael's Patrol summer camp in Saratoga, California, and offered his services in other ways to the apostolate during his vacation. Please keep him in your prayers!
