Dear faithful,

On this 19th Sunday after Pentecost, Dom Guéranger would have us understand the moral doctrine given us by St. Paul in today's Epistle, and what it is he means by that justice, and that holiness of truth, which is that of Christ. We shall find that all the rules of Christian asceticism, as well as of the mystic life are, to St. Paul's mind, summed up in those words: **Be careful to keep unity!** 

It is the principle he lays down for all, both beginners and the perfect. It is the crowning of the most sublime vocation in the order of grace, as well as the foundation and reason of all God's commandments; so truly so, indeed, that if we be commanded to abstain from *lying*, and *speak the truth* to them that live with us, the motive for it all is because *we are members one of another*.

In these difficult times for Holy Mother Church, let us steer clear of the danger of separating from the Church. In her human element, indeed she is gravely ill. Heresies abound, but there have been heresies from the very foundations of the Church. If God has permitted them to gain ascendancy, it must nevertheless be for a reason – **the Church's purification**. She will ultimately be made more faithful, more beautiful, more holy and fervent for having endured and overcome these trials.

The Catholic Church remains forever the Immaculate Bride of Christ. She is the channel through which God's grace flows into our souls through the Sacraments. Only in Her can we hope to find salvation. And her perennial doctrines, those passed down to us from the Apostles, will never fade.

Thank you for your prayers while I was away this week at the Convocation with the other canons. It was my **first time in Louisiana**, a truly beautiful state. The warm, humid air, palm trees, stately southern homes, Spanish moss-lined Oak trees and watery bayous all blended together to create a beautiful, living portrait of the God-given natural charms of the Deep South.

This was an enjoyable and unifying week indeed, as we chanted the Divine Office together, enjoyed delicious Louisiana cuisine (my first time trying fried alligator!), and took in the sights of historic churches and cathedrals. The week also featured splendid liturgies, including a Pontifical Mass and Vespers.

A special thanks to <u>Monsignor Glen John Provost</u>, Bishop of Lake Charles, who amazingly spent almost the entire week with us, meticulously narrating the history of Louisiana during our bus rides, leading us on various tours, and finally delivering an edifying spiritual conference. A big thank you as well to Dr. David Liberto of Notre Dame Seminary (New Orleans), who delivered an excellent conference on the Holy Trinity. I hope to be able to make the recording of this conference available to all of you.
