SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 19, 2023 25TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST (Mass Propers available in the Parish Bulletin)

Dear faithful,

On this Twenty-Fifth Sunday after Pentecost, Dom Prosper Guéranger reminds us that most of us would be put to shame by the fervor and piety of the first Christians:

"We received our regeneration by Baptism at our first coming into the world. We were taught the doctrine of Jesus Christ from our earliest child-hood. And yet, our faith is not so strong, or our lives so holy, as were those of the early Christians. Their main occupation was serving the living and true God, and waiting for the coming of their Savior. Our hope is precisely the same as that which made their hearts so fervent; how comes it that our faith is not like theirs in its generosity? We love this present life, as though we had not the firm conviction that it is to pass away."

Unfortunately, we end up spending much of our time on pursuits far less worth-while than the service of God. There are news stories that hold our attention, but over which we have no control, and which have no real connection to our own lives. Some give copious amounts of time to rather frivolous recreations. Still others fall prey to becoming "workaholic" in nature, gradually extinguishing the life of prayer by an excess of attention to temporal and breadwinning duties. Let us rather, like our Catholic ancestors, seek first the Kingdom of God and trust that He will take care of the rest.

<u>Did you know? Poor Sinners can help the Poor Souls!</u>

Have you ever been tempted to discouragement in the performance of your good works? Don't fall for it! In the Supplement to the *Summa Theologiae*, St. Thomas Aquinas reminds us that good works, such as prayers offered for the dead, can help the Holy Souls in Purgatory even though they are performed by us, who so often fall back into our sins. It is yet another instance of God's unfathomable mercy towards the living and the dead:

"Two things may be considered in the suffrages performed by the wicked. First, the deed done, for instance the sacrifice of the altar. And since our sacraments have their efficacy from themselves independently of the deed of the doer, and are equally efficacious by whomsoever they are performed, in this respect the suffrages of the wicked profit the departed...

Wherefore, although he who acts as the instrument of another be not in a state of merit, his act may be meritorious on account of the principal agent: for instance if a servant being in sin do any work of mercy at the command of his master who has charity. Hence, if a person dying in charity command suffrages to be offered for him, or if some other person having charity prescribe them, those suffrages avail for the departed, even though the persons by whom they are performed be in sin. Nevertheless they would avail more if those persons were in charity, because then those works would be meritorious on two counts" (Supplement, Q. 71, A.3).
