SUNDAY, DECEMBER 17, 2023 THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT (Mass Propers available in the Parish Bulletin)

Dear faithful,

Gaudete in Domino semper! We have already arrived at the Third Sunday of Advent, that on which Holy Mother Church calls us to renewed joy at the coming birth of Our Lord. On it, as on Laetare Sunday, the organ and flowers, forbidden during the rest of the season, are permitted to be used, and rose-colored vestments are worn instead of violet. In the Solemn Mass, the deacon and subdeacon vest again in the dalmatic and tunicle instead of folded chasubles.

In both Office and Mass throughout Advent continual reference is made to our Lord's Second Coming, and this is emphasized today by the additional signs of gladness in the Sacred Liturgy. Gaudete Sunday is further marked by a new Invitatory at the Office of Matins. The Church no longer invites the faithful to adore merely "The Lord who is to come" but calls upon them to worship and hail with joy "The Lord who is now nigh and close at hand".

The Nocturn lessons from the Prophecy of Isaias describe the Lord's Coming and the blessings that will result from it, and the antiphons at Vespers echo again the prophetic promises. The joy of expectation is emphasized by the constant Alleluias, which occur in both Office and Mass throughout the entire season. In the Mass, the Introit "Gaudete in Domino semper" strikes the same note and gives its name to the day.

The spirit of the Office and Liturgy all through Advent is one of expectation and preparation for the Christmas feast as well as for the second coming of Christ, and the penitential exercises suitable to that spirit are thus on Gaudete Sunday suspended for a while in order to symbolize that joy and gladness in the Promised Redemption. May our hearts ever welcome this final coming of Our Lord!

In his December letter to all the faithful of the American apostolates of the Institute of Christ the King, our Provincial Superior <u>Canon Matthew Talarico</u> reminded us that God has great expectations for us, hence His many gifts, spiritual and material. Here in Oakland, thankfully, we see some of our own faithful putting their time and talents to use in service of this apostolate and the less fortunate members of our community.

One question all of us would do well to ask ourselves near the beginning of the new year is: how can I serve God and neighbor more generously in the time to come? God has already given us the best gift of all, His Only-Begotten Son. Let us strive to imitate His generosity with the best utilization possible of our material goods and natural talents during our time on earth.

The monthly <u>Blessing of sacramentals</u> will be next Saturday, December 23 after the 10 am Mass. Please see the instructions for preparing sacramentals in Flocknote. There will also be the monthly <u>training for Altar Servers</u> after these blessings.

<u>Christmas is only a little over a week away!</u> There will be Midnight Mass at 12 am on Monday, December 25, followed by the Mass at Dawn at 7 am and the Mass of the Day at 12:30 pm. Exceptionally, there will not be a 6 pm Mass. We will have lovely traditional <u>Christmas carols</u> before Midnight Mass!

It is only to be expected that a Catholic household should be filled with longing

for the birth of Our Saviour during this season. Have you begun decorating your home with lights outside, a beautiful crèche, holly and other tasteful ornaments to highlight the joy of Our Lord's approaching Nativity?

Around this time in Advent, it is fitting to begin putting up the signs of the coming Savior in your home, while of course still remembering the penitential nature of Advent. Remember not to place the Infant Jesus in his crib until December 25!

A big thank you to all who helped in the organization and cooking for last Sunday's reception for Our Lady of Guadalupe! It was a huge success, and it is sure to repeat next year. Let us always strive to imitate the childlike confidence in the Blessed Mother of Saint Juan Diego, the servant to whom Our Lady deigned to reveal herself for the conversion of so many souls to the Catholic Faith.

St. Margaret Mary Parish will be using Fr. Kozina Hall this Sunday for the Christmas Market. There will be a simple reception on the sidewalk after the 12:30 Mass.
