SUNDAY, DECEMBER 24, 2023 VIGIL OF THE NATIVITY

Dear faithful,

"This day you shall know that the Lord will come, and save us" (Ex. 16;6-7). We celebrate this Sunday the Vigil of the Nativity of Our Lord, <u>Christmas Eve</u>, and this Monday we will celebrate the great feast of <u>Christmas</u>. We live now in the hopeful expectation of Our Lord's return to earth, when He will return as Judge to save the elect and condemn the reprobate. May we live our Faith always so as to be found in His friendship on that all-important day.

The Mass times **this Sunday** are the usual 7 am and 12:30 pm. The Christmas Day Mass times (**this Monday**) are 12 am Midnight (**Christmas Carols** at 11:30 pm Sunday night), 7 am and 12:30 pm. There is **no 6 pm Mass** on Monday. It is necessary to attend one of the Masses on both Sunday and Monday.

A big thank you to all who contributed to our <u>Christmas Eve Toy Drive!</u> Your Christian charity towards the less fortunate families of Oakland is a most agreeable gift not only to them, but also to Our Savior who gave us the gift of His Incarnation.

We must be clear: **God cannot bless sin, and this includes such sinful unions.**

The Archbishop and Auxiliary Bishop of St. Mary of Astana, not to mention other bishops, have responded with a clear reiteration of the **perennial doctrine** of the Church, in stating that such a blessing directly and seriously contradicts Divine Revelation and the uninterrupted, bimillennial doctrine and practice of the Catholic Church.
