SUNDAY, MARCH 10, 2024 FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT (LÆTÁRE) (We offer the Mass Propers in the Parish Bulletin)

Dear faithful.

Laetáre Sunday already! The Fourth Sunday of Lent brings us within view of the Day of Our Lord's Resurrection, Easter Sunday. The joy which Holy Mother Church calls us to this Sunday is reinforced by the return of the organ, rose vestments, and flowers on the altar. Let us then rejoice, for we are children not of Sina, but of Jerusalem. Our mother, the holy Church, is not like the slave, Agar, the mother of Ishmael, but free, like Sara, the mother of Isaac. It is unto freedom that she has brought us up. Israel served God in fear, their hearts were ever tending to idolatry, and could only be kept to duty by the heavy yoke of God's punishments. We, being more blessed, serve God through love. The yoke of Our Lord is sweet, and the burden light. We are not citizens of the earth, but pilgrims passing through it to our true country, the Heavenly Jerusalem, which is above.

His Eminence <u>Cardinal Burke</u> has announced a nine-month <u>Novena to Our Lady of Guadalupe</u>, to begin <u>this Tuesday</u>, <u>March 12</u> and last until December 12. The purpose of this novena is to gain the protection of Our Blessed Mother in this time of war, moral degradation and unprecedented doctrinal error and sin sadly running rampant in the Church, even at the highest levels of the hierarchy.

We will join His Eminence in reciting the Litany of Loreto and the Novena Prayer (attached in Flocknote) after Mass on the twelfth day each month during this period. Did you know? The Great Lenten Veil:

We all know of the veiling of statues at Passiontide, but have you heard of the great Lenten Veil before the sanctuary of centuries past? We must fast during Lent. In former times, to better prepare themselves to live the great mystery of the death and resurrection of Christ, Catholics not only fasted from food, but with their ears and their eyes too.

Auditory privation was accomplished by suppressing organ music and other instruments, but also in many dioceses, the ringing of bells. Visual privation was done by placing grand veils over the Cross and the statues, and of course the prohibition of flowers on the altar. Visual privation also included closing off the sanctuary with a great veil, the Lenten Veil or *velum quadrigesimale*.

In Paris, until around the year 1870, such a veil was hung from the First Sunday of Lent until Spy Wednesday in Holy Week. This great veil, made of violet or ash-colored linen, completely closed off the sanctuary and covered the view of the High Altar. It was dropped on the floor of the sanctuary during the Spy Wednesday (Holy Wednesday) Mass during the chanting of the Passion according to St. Luke, precisely when the Narrator reached the chanting of this verse: "et obscuratus est sol: et velum templi scissum est medium" ("And the sun was darkened, and the veil of the temple was rent in the (Luke 23:45).
