### EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**Introit:** Ecclesiasticus. 36: 18. Give peace, O Lord, to them that patiently wait for Thee, that Thy prophets may be found faithful: hear the prayers of Thy servant, and of Thy people Israel. Ps. 121: 1. I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: We shall go into the house of the Lord. Glory be. Give peace, O Lord.

**Collect:** Let the operation of Thy mercy, we beseech Thee, O Lord, direct our hearts, for without Thee we cannot please Thee. Through our Lord.

**Epistle:** I Corinthians 1: 4-6. Brethren, I give thanks to my God always for you, for the grace of God that is given you in Jesus Christ, that in all things you are made rich in Him, in all utterance and in all knowledge, as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you, so that nothing is wanting to you in any grace, waiting for the manifestation of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Who also will confirm you unto the end without crime, in the day of the coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

**Gradual:** *Psalm 121: 1, 7.* I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: We shall go into the house of Our Lord. Let peace be in thy strength, and abundance in thy towers. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 101: 16.* The gentiles shall fear Thy name, O Lord: and all the kings of the earth Thy glory. Alleluia.

Gospel: St. Matthew 9: 1-8. At that time, Jesus entering into a ship, passed over the water and came into His own city. And behold they brought to Him one sick of the palsy lying in a bed; and Jesus seeing their faith, said to the man sick of the palsy, Be of good heart, son, thy sins are forgiven thee. And behold some of the scribes said within themselves, He blasphemeth. And Jesus seeing their thoughts, said, Why do you think evil in your hearts? which is easier to say, Thy sins are forgiven thee; or to say, Arise and walk? But that you may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins (then said He to the man sick of the palsy). Arise, take up thy bed, and go into thy house. And he arose, and went into his house. And the multitude seeing it, feared, and glorified God Who had given such power to men.

**Offertory:** Exodus 24: 4, 5. Moses consecrated an altar to the Lord, offering upon it holocausts, and sacrificing victims: he made an evening sacrifice to the Lord God for an odor of sweetness, in the sight of the children of Israel.

**Secret:** O God, Who, through the august communication of this sacrifice, dost make us partakers of the one supreme divinity, grant, we beseech Thee, that, as we know Thy truth, so we may ever follow it with worthy actions. Through our Lord.

**Communion:** *Psalm 95: 8, 9.* Bring up sacrifices, and come into His courts: adore ye the Lord in His holy court.

**Postcommunion:** Strengthened by the sacred gift, we render thanks to Thee, O Lord, beseeching Thy mercy that Thou make us entirely worthy to partake thereof. Through our Lord.

# Priest Assignments for St. Mary's Oratory, 2023-2024

Now that the General Chapter of the Institute of Christ the King is past, and the priest assignments are being finalized throughout the growing American Province, we would like to make you aware of the changes that will be taking place here at St. Mary's Oratory.

Canon Huberfeld will continue in his role as rector of the Oratory this coming year and will be present on most weekends. He will maintain his duties in the Diocese of La Crosse as a member of the Presbyteral Council and as the Bishop's delegate for all matters concerning the celebration of the traditional Roman liturgy in the diocese. He will also continue as Vice Provincial for the American Province of the Institute, as National Chaplain of the Society of the Sacred Heart, and as chaplain to the Sister Adorers here in Wausau.

In addition, Canon Huberfeld has been named director of the Institute's new Sacred Heart Retreat Center in Burlington, Wisconsin. He has also been asked by the Institute's Prior General to pursue higher studies with a goal of obtaining a licentiate in sacred theology, specializing in patristics. He will be pursuing this program remotely through St. Augustine's Seminary of the University of Toronto.

Canon Matheus, who has been serving faithfully as our Vicar since 2017, has been named Vice Rector of the Oratory. What this means concretely is that, with Canon Huberfeld's frequent absences from Wausau on weekdays, daily pastoral matters, especially the scheduling of Sacraments, should be addressed through Canon Matheus. Canon Matheus will continue to teach adult theology and catechism along with the sisters and train the altar servers. In addition, he will oversee the formation of the four seminary candidates assigned to Wausau for the
