#### FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY

**Introit:** *Ps. 96, 7, 8.* Adore God, all you His angels: Sion heard, and was glad; and the daughters of Juda rejoiced. *Ps. 96, 1.* The Lord hath reigned; let the earth rejoice: let many islands be glad. *V.* Glory.

**Collect:** O God, Who knowest that we are beset by perils so great as to be unendurable because of our human frailty, grant us health of mind and body, so that by Thine assistance we may conquer the things with which we are afflicted because of our sins. Through our Lord.

**Epistle:** *Romans 13: 8-10.* Brethren, owe no man any thing, but to love one another; for he that loveth his neighbor hath fulfilled the law. For thou shalt not commit adultery, thou shalt not kill, thou shalt not steal, thou shalt not bear false witness, thou shalt not covet, and if there be any other commandment, it is comprised in this word, thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. The love of our neighbor worketh no evil. Love, therefore, is the fulfilling of the law.

**Gradual:** *Ps. 101, 16, 17.* The Gentiles shall fear Thy name, O Lord, and all the kings of the earth Thy glory. *V.* For the Lord hath built up Sion, and He shall be seen in His majesty. Alleluia, alleluia. *V. Ps. 96, 1.* The Lord hath reigned, let the earth rejoice: let many islands be glad. Alleluia.

**Gospel:** *Matt. 8: 23-27.* At that time, when Jesus entered into the ship, His disciples followed Him. And behold a great tempest arose in the sea, so that the ship was covered with waves, but He was asleep. And they came to Him and awaked Him, saying, Lord, save us, we perish. And Jesus saith to them, Why are ye fearful, O ye of little faith? Then rising up, He commanded the winds and the sea, and there came a great calm. But the men wondered, saying, What manner of man is this, for the winds and the sea obey Him?

**Offertory:** *Ps. 117, 16, 17.* The right hand of the Lord hath wrought strength, the right hand of the Lord hath exalted me: I shall not die, but live, and shall declare the works of the Lord.

**Secret:** Grant, we beseech Thee, almighty God, that this sacrifice offered to Thee, may purge us of all evil and fortify our weak nature. Through our Lord.

**Communion:** *Luke 4, 22.* They all wondered at these things, which proceeded from the mouth of God.

**Postcommunion:** May Thy gifts, O God, free us from the allurements of earthly things, and ever restore us with heavenly nourishment. Through our Lord.
