VISITATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Introit: Sedulius. Hail, holy Mother, who in childbirth brought forth the King Who rules heaven and earth forever and ever. **Ps. 44: 2.** My heart overflows with a goodly theme; as I sing my ode to the King. V. Glory.

Collect: Bestow upon Thy servants, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the gift of heavenly grace, that as the child-bearing of the Blessed Virgin marked the beginning of our salvation, so may the solemn feast of her Visitation bring us an increase of peace. Through our Lord.

Commemoration of Fifth Sunday after Pentecost: O God, Who hast prepared good things unseen for them that love Thee, pour into our hearts the fervor of Thy love, that, loving Thee in all things and above all things, we may attain Thy promises, which surpass all desire. Through our Lord.

Epistle: Canticles 2: 8-14. Hark! here He comes springing across the mountains, leaping across the hills. My lover is like a gazelle or a young stag. Here He stands behind our wall, gazing through the windows, peering through the lattices. My lover speaks: He says to me, Arise, make haste, My beloved, My dove, My beautiful one, and come! For see, the winter is past, the rains are over and gone. The flowers appear in our land, the time of pruning has come, and the voice of the turtle is heard in our land. The fig tree puts forth its figs, and the vines, in bloom, give forth fragrance. Arise, My beloved, My beautiful one, and come! O My dove in the clefts of the rock, in the secret recesses of the cliff, let Me see thee, let Me hear thy voice, for thy voice is sweet and thou art lovely.

Gradual: Blessed and venerable art thou, O Virgin Mary, who, without spot wast found the Mother of the Saviour. V. O Virgin, Mother of God, He Whom the whole world does not contain, shut Himself within thy womb, becoming Man. Alleluia, alleluia. V. Happy art thou, O holy Virgin Mary, and most worthy of all praise; for out of thee has risen the sun of justice, Christ our God. Alleluia.

Gospel: Luke 1: 39-47. At that time, Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town of Juda. And she entered the house of Zachary and saluted Elizabeth. And it came to pass, when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, that the babe in her womb leapt. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, and cried out with a loud voice, saying, Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb! And how have I deserved that the Mother of my Lord should come to me? For behold, the moment that the sound of thy greeting came to my ears, the babe in my womb leapt for joy. And blessed is she who has believed, because the things promised her by the Lord shall be accomplished. And Mary said, My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour.

Offertory: Blessed art thou, O Virgin Mary, thou who borest the Creator of all things; thou brought forth Him Who made thee, and remainest a Virgin forever.

Secret: May the humanity of Thy only-begotten Son keep us, O Lord, for He, Who was born of a virgin did not lessen but consecrated the purity of His Mother; so, on the festival of her Visitation may Jesus Christ, our Lord, free us from our sins and make our sacrifice acceptable unto Thee. Through our Lord.

Commemoration of Fifth Sunday after Pentecost: Be propitiated, O Lord, by our supplications, and graciously accept these oblations of Thy servants and Thy handmaidens, that what each has offered to the honor of Thy name may profit for the salvation of all. Through our Lord.

We welcome you today to St. Mary's Oratory!

If this is your first time here, we look forward to meeting you. During the summer, weather permitting, we meet at Oak Island Park after the 10:30 am High Mass. Please join us.

Holy Mass here is celebrated in the traditional Latin Rite. This was the form of worship in use in the Western world from antiquity until 1970. If you are unfamiliar with the traditional Latin Mass, do not hesitate to approach the priests with any questions you may have.

All practicing Catholics in the state of grace are invited to approach the altar rail for Holy Communion. In the traditional Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received kneeling (unless you are impaired from doing so) and on the tongue. The mouth should be open with the tongue slightly extended. You do not look at the priest and you do not say Amen.

The baptistery in the back of the church functions as a crying room during the Mass. Please feel free to make use of it when you have a crying child by exiting quietly down one of the side aisles.

If you are not Catholic, we invite you to learn about our faith. The Church was founded over 2000 years ago by Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. If you are interested in becoming Catholic or learning more about the Catholic faith, please do not hesitate to contact us. The priests of the Oratory offer individual instruction. We look forward to hearing from you.
