*Abundance of our Redemption
by Saint Francis de Sales*

God clearly foresaw that the first man would abuse his liberty, and that forsaking grace he would lose glory, but He did not wish to treat human nature so rigorously as He decreed to treat the angelic.

The devil had taken us away from our natural Lord, and though he had no title to us, yet our Lord redeemed us, redeemed what was His own, to make us more His own, if more His own we could be. St. Paul says: "You are bought with a great price." What is this price? **He redeemed us with the blood of the Lamb;** He pardoned not His own Son, but delivered Him to death for us.

That the sweetness of His mercy might be adorned by the beauty of His justice, He resolved to save man by means of a rigorous redemption, which no one being able to make except His own Son, He appointed that He should redeem men, not merely by one of His loving actions, which would have been more than sufficient to redeem a thousand millions of worlds, but by all the innumerable loving actions and dolorous sufferings He would perform and endure even to death, and the death of the cross, to which He destined Him, wishing that thus He should become the companion of our miseries in order to make us the companions of His glory hereafter, showing in this manner the riches of His goodness by a redemption, copious, abundant, magnificent, and excessive, which acquired, and, as it were, reconquered for us all the means necessary to attain to glory; so that no person can ever complain as if the divine mercy were wanting to him.

The least drop of Our Lord's blood was of infinitely more value than we, and nevertheless, to make us more His own, He wished to shed it all.

Rite of Blessing & Enrollment in the Brown Scapular of

Our Lady of Mt. Carmel

(You may bring your own Brown Scapular or one will be provided.)

Practical Tips about the Scapular:

- 1) The Scapular must be worn around the neck.
- 2) One has to be enrolled only once in the Confraternity.
- 3) Worn-out Scapulars are to be burned or buried. When one acquires a new Scapular, there is no need to have it blessed and no need to be re-enrolled.
- 4) St. Pius X approved the Scapular Medal for those in torrid climates and for those with sensitive skin (with same spiritual benefits as the Scapular of cloth).

Why enrollment?

To be eligible for the *Scapular Promise*, one must be enrolled in the Brown Scapular Confraternity to become an affiliated member of the Carmelite Order. They also participate in the spiritual benefits, merits, and prayers of the entire Carmelite Order.

Sabbatine Privilege:

Appearing to Pope John XXII, Our Lady said : "I, the Mother of Grace, shall descend on the Saturday after their death and whomsoever I shall find in purgatory I shall free so that I may lead them to the holy mountain of life everlasting."

The Blessed Virgin attached the following conditions:

1. Wear the Brown Scapular continuously.
2. Observe chastity according to one's state in life (single or married)
3. Sabbatine Privilege - Recite daily the *Little Office of the Blessed Virgin* **OR** with explicit permission of a priest, recite daily five decades of Our Lady's Most Holy Rosary.

The Popes and the Brown Scapular

Pope Leo XIII: "The Carmelite Scapular's nobility of origin, its extraordinary spread among Christian peoples for many centuries, the spiritualizing effects produced by it and the outstanding miracles worked in virtue of it render the Scapular of Carmel commendable to a wondrous degree."

Pope Pius XI: "In consideration of the munificent goodness of the heavenly Mother towards her children, it surely ought to be sufficient merely to exhort those who belong to the Scapular Confraternity to persevere in the holy exercises which have been prescribed for the gaining of the indulgences to which they are entitled."

Pope Pius XII: "All Carmelites, whether they live in the cloisters of the First or Second Orders or are members of the Third Order or of the Confraternities, belong to the same family of our Most Blessed Mother and are attached to it by a special bond of love. May they all see in this keepsake of the Virgin herself a mirror of humility and purity; may they read in the very simplicity of the Garment a concise lesson in modesty and simplicity; above all, may they behold in this same Garment, which they wear day and night, the eloquent expressive symbol of their prayers for divine assistance."

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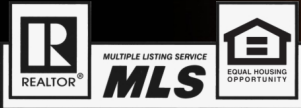
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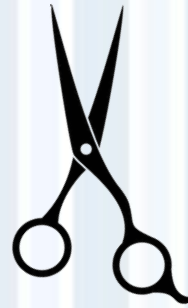


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POST - COMMUNION PRAYER
