There is no clock, no matter how good it may be, that doesn't need resetting and rewinding twice a day, once in the morning and once in the evening. In addition, at least once a year it must be taken apart to remove the dirt clogging it, straighten out bent parts and repair those worn out. In like manner, every morning and evening a person who really takes care of his heart must rewind it for God's service by means of certain practices of piety. 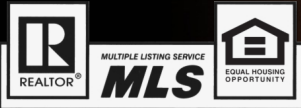

ACT OF CONSECRATION TO THE HOLY FAMILY

To be recited by Christian families
who consecrate themselves to the
Holy Family.

"O Jesus, our most loving Saviour! Thou Who wast sent down from Heaven to enlighten the world by Thy teaching and example, and Who didst will to pass the greater part of Thy holy life in Nazareth, subject to Mary and Joseph, and thereby didst hallow the household which was to be the pattern for all Christian families, do Thou in Thy goodness receive our household which Athis day consecrates itself to Thee. Protect and guard us, strengthen us in Thy holy fear, establish in our hearts the peace and concord of Christian Charity, so that each one of us becoming like to the Divine model of Thy family, may be sharers of eternal joy."

"O Mary, most loving Mother of Jesus Christ, our Mother, through thy love and mercy intercede, that Jesus receive this act of Consecration, and pour out upon us His graces and blessings."

"O Joseph, most holy Guardian of Jesus and Mary, help us by thy prayers in all our necessities, both of body and soul; that together with the Blessed Virgin mary and thyself we shall praise and thank Jesus Christ, our Divine Redeemer."

Renewal Prayer -

Lord Jesus Christ, Who, being subject to Mary and Joseph, didst consecrate domestic life by Thine ineffable virtues; grant that we, with the assistance of both, may be taught by the example of Thy holy Family and may attain to its everlasting fellowship. Who livest and reignest, world without end. Amen. (*Roman Missal*)

Week of Prayer for an End to Schism

Ad tollendum schisma

Jan. 18 - Jan. 25

Beginning on the feast of the Chair of St. Peter of Rome on Jan. 18, we pray until the feast of the conversion of St. Paul on Jan. 25 for the return to the fullness of the Catholic Church those separated brethren currently outside the Church of Christ. This is in particular a great time to pray for fallen away family members! During these dates, there will be a Collect, Secret, and Post-Communion added to each Mass for this intention replacing the prayer for the Pope (pro Papa).

Collect: O God, who setteth straight what has gone astray, and gatherest together what is scattered, and keepest what Thou has gathered together: we beseech Thee in Thy mercy to pour down on Christian people that grace of union with Thee, that putting disunion aside and joining themselves to the true Shepherd of Thy Church, they may be able to render Thee worthy service. Through our Lord Jesus Christ...

Secret: Sanctify, O Lord, for the union of Christian people, these gifts offered to Thee; and by their means grant us the grace of union and peace within Thy Church. Through our Lord...

Post-Communion: We beseech Thee, O Lord, that this Thy holy communion which we have received, as it represents the union of the faithful in Thee, so may it bring about reunion in Thy Church. Through our Lord...

Octave of prayer for an end to schism, for the return of separated brethren to the Catholic Faith (Jan. 18–25)

ANTIPHON (ALL): That they all may be one, as Thou, Father, in Me and I in Thee; that they also may be one in Us; that the world may believe that Thou hast sent Me.

(PRIEST): I say unto thee, thou art Peter;

(ALL): And upon this rock I will build My Church.

Here the priest mentions the intention for the day's prayer:

Jan 18: For the return of the "other sheep" to the One Fold of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Jan 19: For the return of the Eastern Orthodox Christians to communion with the Apostolic See.

Jan 20: For the return of the Anglicans to the authority of the Vicar of Christ.

Jan 21: For the return of all Protestants throughout the world to the unity of the Catholic Church.

Jan 22: That Christians in America may be one, in union with the Chair of Saint Peter.

Jan 23: That lapsed Catholics will return to the Sacraments of the Church.

Jan 24: That the Jewish people will be converted to the Catholic Faith.

Jan 25: That missionary zeal will conquer the world for Christ.

Let us pray. *(PRIEST):* O Lord Jesus Christ, who said unto Thine Apostles: Peace I leave you, My peace I give to you; regard not our sins, but the faith of Thy Church, and grant unto her that peace and unity which are agreeable to Thy Will; Who livest and reignest ever, one God, world without end. Amen.
