LITURGICAL NOTES

When is Sunday Compline Sung?

Compline of Sunday is sung on all Feasts of the 1st and 2nd class. Feasts of the 1st class also have 1st Vespers which initiate the Feast on the evening before. (For example, First Vespers of Christmas are sung on the evening of December 24.) This why Compline of Sunday is sung this coming Tuesday, April 30. It falls after the First Vespers of St. Joseph the Worker, which Feast is celebrated on May 1.

Extra Collects

Those who attentively follow the liturgy may have noticed that priests of the Institute of Christ the King often add an extra Collect, Secret and Postcommunion to the Mass of the day. These are the prayers pro Papa (for the Pope) found in the Roman Missal. In the Institute, these prayers constitute an oratio imperata (a "commanded prayer," issued from a competent authority, such as the Bishop or Superior General), by which we apply our Constitutions by praying for the Holy Father. The days when these prayers are forbidden are few (such as 1st class feasts); for the sake of brevity, we do not list these extra collects in the liturgical calendar column of this bulletin.

In addition, a priest may add an extra collect of his choosing on liturgical days of the 4th class. On the days where it is permitted, Canon Silvey will sometimes choose an extra collect from the Missal, such as pro seipso Sacerdote (for the priest himself), contra persecutores Ecclesiae (against the persecutors of the Church), contra persecutores et male agentes (against persecutors and evildoers), ad postulandam serenitatem (for serenity), and pro remissionem peccatorum (for the remission of sins).

SACRAMENTS CORNER

Are you registered?

If you consider St. Leo Oratory as your parish, be sure to register using the forms available at the entrances. Active, registered members fulfill their Sunday obligation weekly or at least regularly at the Oratory, and contribute to the Oratory according to their means.

Conversion to the Catholic Faith

Those who desire to become Catholic are encouraged to contact the rector of the Oratory by phone (614–443–7685) or email (stleo@icksp.org).

Infant Baptism

Parents requesting infant baptism for their child should be active, registered members of the Oratory (otherwise, permission from your pastor must be obtained). Infants should be baptized within the first three weeks after birth (Code of Canon Law, 867 §1). Contacting the rector a few weeks before the child's birth is strongly recommended.

First Communion & Confirmation

Parents should be active, registered members of the Oratory (otherwise, permission from your pastor must be obtained). Contact the rector for information on preparation and enrolling your child for the next First Communion or Confirmation ceremony.

Extreme Unction (Anointing of the Sick)

If an individual is facing a dangerous illness or even death, call 614–443–7685.

Holy Matrimony

Ordinarily, at least one party must be an active, registered member of the Oratory. Couples desirous of marrying at the Oratory should contact the rector a minimum of seven months prior to their desired wedding date for more information. The Oratory wedding policy is available upon request.
