# Thursday, May 30: Feast of Corpus Christi

High Mass at 6:30pm, followed by Eucharistic Procession.

## Did you know?

The traditional date of Corpus Christi is the Thursday after the Octave of Pentecost. The choice of the Thursday highlights the connection with Maundy Thursday during Holy Week, when Our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist. Though generally transferred to Sunday in the United States, outside of the United States, Corpus Christi Thursday remains, as a rule, a Holy Day of Obligation.

# Friday, June 7: Feast of the Sacred Heart

This coincides with First Friday this year. Low Mass at 12:00 noon High Mass at 7:00pm, followed by Litany of the Sacred Heart and Act of Reparation to the Sacred Heart.

# Did you know?

Many feasts had octave celebrations until 1955, when all but three were suppressed. These feasts included, among many others, the Ascension, Corpus Christi, and the Sacred Heart. Perhaps one day we will see these beautiful traditions restored. Our Lord made reference to the Octave of Corpus Christi when instituting the Feast of the Sacred Heart:

"Therefore *I ask of you that the first Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi be dedicated as a feast in honour of My Heart*, and amends made to It in an *Act of Reparation* offered to It and by the reception of Holy Communion on that day, to atone for the outrages It has received during the time It has been exposed on the Altars. I promise you that My Heart will open wide and pour forth lavishly the influence of Its Divine love on all who will render and procure for It this honour."

(Words of Our Lord to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1675.)

# <u>Saturday, June 29: Feast of Sts. Peter & Paul</u> High Mass at 9:00am

# Did you know?

The Feast of the Sts. Peter & Paul, Apostles is one of the Holy Days of Obligation listed by the Code of Canon Law (Can. 1246 §1). The law, however, gives the authority to bishops' conferences to suppress holy days or transfer them to Sunday in their regions (Can. 1246 §2). In the United States, the U.S. Bishop's have not maintained June 29 as a day of obligation. Nonetheless, the feast's placement among the holy days of obligation in the universal law of the Church manifests the importance of this feast for Catholics, as it highlights our attachment to the See of Peter as an essential element of our Catholic identity.

## SACRAMENTS CORNER

### Are you registered?

If you consider St. Leo Oratory as your parish, be sure to register using the forms available at the entrances. Active, registered members fulfill their Sunday obligation weekly or at least regularly at the Oratory, and contribute to the Oratory according to their means.

### Conversion to the Catholic Faith

Those who desire to become Catholic are encouraged to contact the rector of the Oratory by phone (614–443–7685) or email (stleo@icksp.org).

## <u>Infant Baptism</u>

Parents requesting infant baptism for their child should be active, registered members of the Oratory (otherwise, permission from your pastor must be obtained). Infants should be baptized within the first three weeks after birth (Code of Canon Law, 867 §1). Contacting the rector a few weeks before the child's birth is strongly recommended.

### First Communion & Confirmation

Parents should be active, registered members of the Oratory (otherwise, permission from your pastor must be obtained). Contact the rector for information on preparation and enrolling your child for the next First Communion or Confirmation ceremony.

### Extreme Unction (Anointing of the Sick)

If an individual is facing a dangerous illness or even death, call 614–443–7685.

### Holy Matrimony

Ordinarily, at least one party must be an active, registered member of the Oratory. Couples desirous of marrying at the Oratory should contact the rector a minimum of seven months prior to their desired wedding date for more information. The Oratory wedding policy is available upon request.
