FROM OUR MICHIGAN BISHOPS | PROP 3 | SAY “NO”

Based on an analysis of the proposal and ballot summary language, it is clear this proposed amendment to the state constitution intends to: Repeal existing laws requiring informed consent for abortion and parental consent requirements for teens seeking abortion. Repeal existing laws requiring abortion clinics to be licensed and inspected for health and safety reasons. Allow anyone to perform an abortion and prohibit any legal consequences if a woman is harmed. Allow for late-term abortions due to an undefined mental health exemption in the proposal. Define viability to apply only to children who can survive without extraordinary medical care.
