FROM OUR PASTOR, REV. CANON COMMINS

Prayer, at first glance, is humiliating and our human nature doesn't like humiliations. It appears to be egotistic, self-interested which seems to deprive it from a certain noblesse. All of this then, justifies its necessity in our lives because it expresses, it shows our indigence, or spiritual and moral poverty which in turn forces us to put all our trust and confidence in God, the Good Shepherd. In fact, how could man distance himself from God and reject his helping hand, when as we read in the Acts, *it is in him that we live, and move, and have our being; for indeed, we are his children.* When the sheep hears the voice of the shepherd, he must trust the call, follow the attraction to the Good Shepherd and be docile to the motion that God sends to take him to the resting-place where there is green pasture.
