FROM THE LIBER SACRAMENTORUM OF BLESSED ILDEPHONSE CARDINAL SCHUSTER

The Gospel reading from Matthew (6:24-33) excludes all possibility of a soul divided. We cannot serve God and material goods at the same time, but we must above all seek the Lord through the observance of His law, expecting from His Providence all that will be truly necessary for the well-being of our body. This does not imply a fatalistic resignation, which, in the idleness of body and spirit, claims to receive everything from the Lord by miracle, but only moderates human activity and contains it within the limits set by God, who, while ordering us to provide for our needs by the sweat of our brow, forbids us to become excessively attached to them, as if man were only flesh and matter, or as if Divine Providence did not exist. The popular proverb expresses the right order of things very well: help yourself, and Heaven will help you.

Dear parishioners, it's never too early to start thinking about Oktoberfest! Save the date, Sept. 21 and 22. There are many new exciting developments for Oktoberfest this year, many opportunities for everyone to get involved.

Here are three of the changes coming this year

1: We will be developing a commemorative T shirt this year by kicking it off a logo design contest. We want everyone to submit their designs by August 3. All designs will be on display on the social hall for the week of August 4-10 during which time you can vote for your favorite. The winner will be announced August 11.
