

Our Moral Compass

Our Lord is counseling nothing less than perfection, but He is also showing us the path of least resistance to achieve that perfection.

If our "moral compass" is oriented toward nothing more than avoiding sin, we will have a difficult time indeed. But if it is oriented toward living the virtues, it will become considerably easier.

In practice, that will take some effort on our part. It means making a "conversion of heart and manners"

for most of us. It means rising above the environment in which we live, detaching ourselves from the enjoyment our world takes from avarice, and immodesty, from unnecessary violence, and false pretensions, to greatness.

It means detachment from the "glitzy" things around us, even though these appear to be superficially important. It means "being," as they say, "in the world, but not of the world."

Our Lord has given us this lofty goal of perfection -- but He has also given us the path to follow in order to become perfect. "You therefore are to be perfect, even as your heavenly Father is perfect."

"Blessed are the poor in spirit.... the meek.... those who mourn.... those who hunger and thirst for justice.... the merciful.... the clean of heart.... the peacemakers.... those who undergo persecution for justice sake... " and for God's sake.

Blessed are those who pursue the virtues of God, rather than the vices of the devil -- blessed are those who would be perfect.

Sts. Peter & Paul

Saturday, June 29 - 9:00 a.m. Mass Veneration of the relics after Mass

St. Peter and St. Paul (1st c.) were the foremost Apostles of Jesus Christ; St. Peter was the leader of the Twelve, while St. Paul followed Christ after His ascension into heaven. Together the two saints are the founders of the Church in Rome through their apostolic preaching, ministry, and martyrdom in that city. They are the solid rock on which the foundation of the Catholic Church is built, and they will forever remain her protectors and guides. To them Rome owes her true greatness, for it was under God's providential guidance that they

transformed the capital of the Roman Empire into the heart of the Church, with the mission to radiate the Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ throughout the world. Both saints were martyred in close proximity to one another; Peter first, then Paul, though some traditions claim they were killed on the same day. St. Peter was crucified upside down and buried on the hill of the Vatican where St. Peter's Basilica now stands. St. Paul was beheaded on the via Ostia and buried where the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls now stands. St. Peter and St. Paul are the patron saints of Rome and they share a feast day on June 29, a tradition going back to the earliest centuries of the Church.


How do you offer a Mass for someone?


We see in the church Bulletin, "This Mass is being offered for the intentions of [someone]." What does this mean, and how do we offer a Mass for a friend, a family member or the deceased?

The Mass is the most powerful of all prayers, so it is a very effective way to pray for loved ones. Praying for loved ones through the Mass is an ancient tradition. While you can personally offer your prayers at Mass for a special intention, requesting that a priest say a Mass for your intention can be even more powerful because the priest himself has offered the Mass for that intention.

You can offer a Mass for family members, friends, or any special intention, but Masses offered for the dead are particularly powerful. In fact, many souls have actually appeared to loved ones to ask for Masses to be said for them so that they will be released from Purgatory. Since the souls in Purgatory are no longer able to pray for

themselves, they rely on the prayers and good works of those still on earth to help them enter heaven sooner. Jesus loves them so much that He will often release a soul sooner when such prayers as the Mass are offered.





To have a Mass offered, please print names legibly on a slip of paper, Include the intention of the Mass and who it is offered by if you choose.

Insert it in an envelope and indicate "Attn: Mass stipend". You may place it in the normal weekly collection basket or mail it to the Rectory (Please make checks payable to: ICKSP Green Bay). Please limit your requests to 10 per family per year. For emergencies (i.g. a loved one who just passed away) please contact Canon Boucheron.




Sister Adorers Collection Update
