

VISITING A CEMETARY FOR A PLENARY INDULGENCE

A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory is granted each and every day from Nov 1 to Nov 8, those faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and there pray, if only mentally, for the departed (with the usual requirements).

For faithful Catholics to gain a plenary indulgence, they must perform the work to which a plenary indulgence is attached and fulfill the usual conditions, which are:

- ◆ to be in the state of grace
- ◆ have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin
- ◆ have sacramentally confessed their sins
- ◆ have received Holy Communion
- ◆ pray for the intentions of the Holy Father

It is appropriate, but not necessary, that Confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the Pope's intentions take place on the same day that the indulgenced work is performed; but it is sufficient that these be carried out within 20 days before or after the indulgenced act. Prayer for the Pope's intentions is left to the choice of the faithful, but an "Our Father" and a "Hail Mary" are suggested. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Holy Father's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.
