SUNDAY, MAY 26, 2024 TRINITY SUNDAY

Dear faithful,

The Season of Sundays after Pentecost, and the formal end of Paschaltide, begins this Sunday, May 26, the <u>Feast of the Most Holy Trinity</u>. The Holy Triune God is, of course, the absolute principal and end of all acts of religion, whether public or private, and is thus honored in all of them. Why did Holy Mother Church deem it fitting to set aside one Sunday a year to especially honor the Holy Trinity? Dom Prosper Guéranger gives us this insight in *The Liturgical Year*:

"Up to about the year 1000, the Feasts of Saints marked on the general Calendar and universally kept were very few. From that time, they began to be more numerous; and there was evidence that their number would go on increasing. The time would come when the Sunday's Office, which is specially consecrated to the blessed Trinity, must make way for that of the Saints, as often as one of their Feasts occurred on a Sunday. As a sort of compensation for this celebration of the memory of God's Servants on the very day which was sacred to the Holy Trinity, it was considered right that once, at least, in the course of the Year a Sunday should be set apart for the exclusive and direct expression of the worship which the Church pays to the great God, who has vouchsafed to reveal himself to mankind in his ineffable Unity and in his eternal Trinity."

Monsignor Wach has returned to Oakland after a long absence! The founder and Prior General of the Institute of Christ the King, Monsignor Gilles Wach, and Canon Matthew Talarico, U.S. Provincial Superior of the Institute, are with us at St. Margaret Mary's this Sunday. Monsignor Wach will celebrate a Solemn Mass at 12:30 pm, and then join us for the reception afterwards.

Many of you have never met Monsignor, but he would be gratified by your presence at the 12:30 Mass and the reception following it. All are welcome to greet Monsignor and thank him for all he has done to keep our apostolate going — our new faithful and families, those who discovered the Oakland Apostolate during Covid, the altar servers' families, our various volunteers, seniors, young adults, everyone. We hope you will come and greet the father and founder of our dear institute, who has done so much for us!

Thank you for your prayers for me during the <u>Chartres Pilgrimage</u>! I tried to remember all the intentions confided to me during the pilgrimage, especially with each painful footstep, the hardships of camp life, and every joyful chant of the *Ave Maria*. It was a great joy to finally take part as a priest and see the <u>wonderful fruits</u> of this pilgrimage, such as an ardent desire for the Sacrament of Confession, and the many young adults and families who made up the majority of the pilgrims. Truly, the Catholic Faith and Mass of <u>Tradition</u> is what the younger generations are hungering for. In the words of the Psalmist in each Holy Mass, from the Prayers at the Foot of the Altar – "I will go in unto the altar of God, to God who giveth <u>joy to my youth!</u>" (Psalm 42).

I also had the joy of <u>returning to the seminary</u> for several days after the pilgrimage. It is a privilege and indeed necessary for a canon of the Institute to

return from time to time to our motherhouse, Gricigliano, where our formation took place. The waters of our souls need to be replenished at the source at times! I was also able to greet many of the seminarians, including <u>Abbé Paul Torreano</u> from our <u>San Jose Apostolate</u>, <u>Immaculate Heart of Mary Oratory</u>. He sends the assurance of his prayers!

A big "Thank you" to <u>Canon Commins and</u> <u>Canon Bell</u> for replacing me during my time away. Your fraternal charity will not be forgotten, Canons!

As this Monday is <u>Memorial Day</u>, please set aside a moment to remember in your prayers the souls of all those who died in defense of our nation, so that we could enjoy freedom. *Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls, and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace.*Amen.

Finally, remember that the Marian Antiphon reverts to the *Salve Regina* this Sunday (attached in Flocknote).
