SUNDAY, JUNE 23, 2024 5TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST (We offer the Mass Propers in the Parish Bulletin)

Dear faithful,

As this month of the <u>Sacred Heart of Jesus</u> continues, Our Lord fittingly warns us on this Fifth Sunday after Pentecost against harboring anger in our hearts. It is not literally that an angry word is as culpable as a mortal blow, but the source of both is a certain disposition of the human heart. Such a disposition should not be found at all in the Christian heart, or if it finds harbor there, it should be only for a moment. Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make our hearts like unto Thine.

<u>This Monday</u>, June 24 is a grand feast indeed, the <u>Nativity of St. John the Baptist</u>. This is a first-class feast, and it is understandable why. This saint was the greatest of the Prophets and the Precursor of Our Lord; he announced Christ's revelation of Himself as the Messiah.

The words of St. John the Baptist, "Behold the Lamb of God..." are so treasured by Holy Mother Church that they have entered the rubrics of the Holy Mass itself ("Ecce, Agnus Dei..."). Indeed, the greatest compliment the Church can pay to the prayers of the saints is to canonize their words in the Sacred Liturgy, for this is the highest form of prayer in Heaven and on earth. It is worth our whole life's effort to come to know and appreciate the symbolism of the liturgical ceremonies more and more.

If you have never read the <u>encyclical Mediator Dei</u> of Pope Pius XII (November 20, 1947), I highly recommend doing so. One of the more salient points of this document is that Holy Mother Church does not seek to destroy the organic development of the Mass over the last two thousand years, accomplished by the inspiration of the Holy Ghost, in order to return to the very simple rites of the primitive Church:

"...It is neither wise nor laudable to reduce everything to antiquity by every possible device. Thus, to cite some instances, one would be <u>straying from the straight path</u> were he to wish the altar restored to its primitive table form; were he to want black excluded as a color for the liturgical vestments; were he to forbid the use of sacred images and statues in Churches; were he to order the crucifix so designed that the divine Redeemer's body shows no trace of His cruel sufferings; and lastly were he to disdain and reject polyphonic music or singing in parts, even where it conforms to regulations issued by the Holy See" (n. 62)

Could I ask you to please keep <u>my father</u> in your prayers? He had a fall recently and sustained a few broken bones. Fortunately, it looks like there is a road to recovery for him. Deo gratias!
