FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING  
(We offer the Mass Propers in the Parish Bulletin)

Dear Faithful,

This Sunday, October 27 is the **Feast of Christ the King**, the first-class titular feast of our dear institute. It was with the encyclical *Quas Primas* (December 11, 1925) that Pope Pius XI gloriously proclaimed the Kingship of Christ over all the universe, including societies and governments, and not only individual persons. His Kingship is of course in reason of the Hypostatic Union, this most intimate union of the Divine and human natures of Christ in His One Person. The Pope explained that while papal encyclicals and decrees tend to reach only a few (and the most learned) minds, feasts are a wonderful boon to the entire Church, especially the humblest souls:

“The liturgical honors paid to confessors, virgins and widows produced wonderful results in an increased zest for virtue, necessary even in times of peace. But more fruitful still were the feasts instituted in honor of the Blessed Virgin. As a result of these men grew not only in their devotion to the Mother of God as an ever-present advocate, but also in their love of her as a mother bequeathed to them by their Redeemer. Not least among the blessings which have resulted from the public and legitimate honor paid to the Blessed Virgin and the saints is the perfect and perpetual immunity of the Church from error and heresy” (n. 22)

How interesting and indeed how fitting that Pope Pius XI thought it appropriate to cite the example of feasts of the Blessed Virgin in shedding light on the institution of the Feast of Christ the King. In Heaven, Our Blessed Mother reigns alongside her Son as His Queen. May we never separate these two in our devotion. The Sacred and Immaculate Hearts reign in glory, and united forever.

Following the tradition, we will recite the **Act of Consecration of the Human Race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus** following both Masses, and there will be a **Eucharistic Procession** following the 12:30 Mass. The ceremonies at the 12:30 Mass will be very beautiful, but **significantly longer** than usual. Please plan accordingly. There will be a simple reception with some refreshments on the sidewalk after the ceremonies.

The Institute of Christ the King takes up the annual **Special Collection for the Institute’s Seminary** every year on the Feast of Christ the King. Thank you for your generosity in helping the Institute form your future priests!

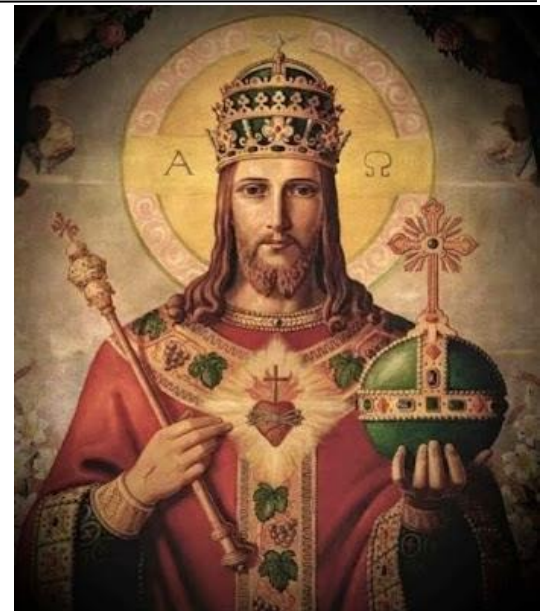
The Mass schedule for **All Saints’ Day** (November 1, a **Holy Day of Obligation**) and **All Souls’ Day** (November 2) is as follows: on Friday, November 1, there will be a **High Mass at 6 pm**, followed by First Friday devotions. On Saturday, November 2, there will be a Low Requiem Mass at **6:30 am**, again at **10 am** and a High Requiem Mass at **12 pm**.

Our **visit to St. Mary’s Cemetery** in Oakland (4529 Howe Street) to pray for the souls of our beloved faithful departed will take place on **Thursday, November 7** after the 12 pm Mass. These prayers carry a plenary indulgence applicable to the Holy Souls, under the usual conditions.

A **plenary indulgence** applicable to the Holy Souls is traditionally attached to any prayers offered for them in a cemetery from **November 1-8**. For more information, see the November indulgences **guidelines** in Flocknote.

The monthly training for the **Altar Servers** will be on Saturday, November 9 from 11:30 – 12:30, with lunch afterwards. We hope to see you there!
