
Fall Fundraising Banquet

Introduction to the Devout Life

By St. Francis de Sales

The Conclusion and Spiritual Bouquet (Book 2, Chapter 7)



The meditation should be concluded by three acts, made with the utmost humility. First, an act of thanksgiving; thanking God for the affections and resolutions with which He has inspired you, and for the Mercy and Goodness He has made known to you in the mystery you have been meditating. Secondly, an act of oblation, by which you offer your af-

fections and resolutions to God, in union with His Own Goodness and Mercy, and the Death and Merits of His Son. The third act is one of petition, in which you ask God to give you a share in the Merits of His Dear Son, and a blessing on your affections and resolutions, to the end that you may be able to put them in practice. You will further pray for the Church, and all her Ministers, your relations, friends, and all others, using the Our Father as the most comprehensive and necessary of prayers. Besides all this, I bade you gather a little bouquet of devotion, and what I mean is this. When walking in a beautiful garden most people are wont to gather a few flowers as they go, which they keep, and enjoy their scent during the day. So, when the mind explores some mystery in meditation, it is well to pick out one or more points that have specially arrested the attention, and are most likely to be helpful to you through the day, and this should be done at once before quitting the subject of your meditation.

Catechism UPDATE!!

Catechism classes begin again next Sunday, **Sept 10**th with 243 students enrolled in 11 classes as of late August. With the growth, especially in the lower grades, we now must have two classes each for the First and Second Grades. Our thanks to Patty Petrosky and Delaney Stull for joining the faculty and teaching these two new sections. In an effort to alleviate the parking crunch that occurs between the end of classes and the start of High Mass every week, some changes to the weekly Catechism schedule are unfortunately necessary. Classes will begin five minutes earlier, at 9:25, and will be dismissed ten minutes earlier, at 10:15. By lengthening the gap from 30 to 45 minutes, we hope the parking pressure will be reduced. On the first day, we will not have a Plenary Assembly in the gym, as has been the recent custom. Students should go directly to their classrooms for a full class session.

ALL Catechism families attending 8AM Mass are asked to please vacate parking areas once Catechism classes have been dismissed at 10:15 AM. Folks arriving for 11AM Mass need access to those parking areas, often by 10:30AM or earlier. You will be rewarded for your Charity and thoughtfulness in this matter.

As a reminder, parking in the back of the school is by PERMIT ONLY during the Catechism school year. If you do not have a parking permit, please do not park vehicles in the rear parking lot of the school.

ICK Pilgrimage to France

A new group pilgrimage, will take place in 2024 with the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest. Our friends at St. Charles Catholic Pilgrimages have organized an extraordinary two-part exploration of France to be led by Canon Benoît Jayr of St. Stanislaus Oratory in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. All members of the Institute family are invited to take advantage of one or both pilgrimage opportunities. In the first pilgrimage opportunity, from May 15–20, pilgrims will participate in the historic Chartres Pentecost Pilgrimage. This walking pilgrimage is the largest annual traditional Catholic event in the world today, drawing more than 16,000 participants from across the globe. Pilgrims set out on a three-day trek (with two nights camping), walking from the Church of Saint-Sulpice in Paris to Notre-Dame in Chartres. In the second pilgrimage, from May 20–31,



pilgrims will embark on a 12-day, faith-inspiring tour of the major shrines of France, beginning in Vers sur Launette near Paris with Holy Mass in the private chapel of the Institute's Sister Adorers of the Royal Heart of Jesus and conclude with a celebration dinner at

Canon Jayr's family farm near Montauban in southwestern France. Highlights include: Daily Latin Mass with Canon Jayr; Special visit to Le Barroux Abbey for sung High Mass; Opportunities to pray in the presence of incorrupt saints such as St. Catherine Labouré, St. Vincent de Paul, St. Bernadette, and St. John Vianney; A full day in Lourdes with a visit to the miraculous baths; Visit to the tomb of St. Martin of Tours; Visit to the Holy Face Oratory in Tours; Mass at the Institute chapel in Toulouse; Visit to Carcassonne Castle with time for shopping; Visit to the tomb of St. Thomas Aguinas; Dinner in Avignon, served with local wine; Visit and dinner at the family farm of Canon Jayr. To All Our Guests...

The Canons and Faithful of Most Precious Blood of Jesus Parish welcome you and hope that your time in "The 'Burgh" may be an opportunity to share in the tradition of the Roman Catholic Faith. Please enjoy the beauty of this Personal Parish, established by Bishop David Zubik on July 1, 2019 on the *Feast of The Most Precious Blood of Jesus*.

According to liturgical tradition and the Traditional Latin Mass of the Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received kneeling and on the tongue. All visitors who are not of the Catholic Faith are welcome to join us in prayer but are requested not to receive Holy Communion. Because reception of Holy Communion is the sign of Divine and Ecclesial unity, only practicing Catholics who are free of mortal sin, and have observed the Eucharistic Fast, should present themselves for Holy Communion. For those who need a low gluten Host, let an usher know as you approach the Communion rail toward the end of Communion.
