At that time, when a very great multitude was gathered together and hastened out of the cities unto Jesus, He spoke by a similitude: The sower went out to sow his seed: and as he sowed, some fell by the wayside, and it was trodden down, and the fowls of the air devoured it. And other some fell upon a rock: and as soon as it was sprung up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. And other some fell among the thorns, and the thorns, growing up with it, choked it. But that on the good ground, are they who in a good and perfect heart, hearing the word, keep it and bring forth fruit in patience.

Liturgical Note

Septuagesimatide, or pre-Lent, is the name given to the two and a half weeks, with its three consecutive Sundays, preceding Ash Wednesday. It is named after the first of these, Septuagesima Sunday, which occurs roughly seventy days before Easter (Septuagesima is Latin for seventieth). Sexagesima (sixtieth) comes next, followed by Quinquagesima (fiftieth) which is the Sunday before Ash Wednesday.



February 12 & 13 Eucharistic Adoration in **Reparation for Public Sins**

Eucharistic Adoration in reparation for public sins after the noon Mass until 2:00pm on Monday, February 12 and Tuesday, February 13.

In the encyclical, Miserentissimus Redemptor, Pope Pius XI spoke of the duty of reparation: "... if ... the creature's love should be given in return for the love of the Creator, another thing follows from this at once, namely that to the same uncreated Love, if so be it has been neglected by forgetfulness or violated by offense, some sort of compensation must be rendered for the injury, and this debt is commonly called by the name of reparation". Reparation is a beautiful and essential element of our Catholic faith wherein some act of mortification is offered as a voluntary act of love to repair injustice.


