### Lenten Pilgrimage

In the Jubilee Holy Year join fellow Catholics for a walking pilgrimage to Shrines of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Canon Moreau from St. Francis de Sales Oratory, Sulphur will be the celebrant for the TLM. The Most Reverend David Toups, Bishop of Beaumont, will offer the Final Blessing at the end of day around 4 pm.

It kicks off at Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic Church, 9 a.m. March 15 with the Traditional Latin Mass. Parking available at OLOG with a shuttle at the end back to the parking lot. Parking recommended that morning between 7 and 8 a.m. at Queen of Peace Shrine, 800 Ninth Ave, Pt. Arthur 77642 in time for the 55-passenger bus shuttle to OLOG. First bus leaves Shrine at 7:10 a.m. and last bus at 8:15 a.m.

Police escort provided as well as bread and water on an itinerary with time for the Bridge City KC's to fry up a catfish snack, a stop at the cemetery to pray for the Poor Souls, a stop at a beautiful church to pray the Stations and end at another local Shrine to Our Lady Queen of Peace.

This year's theme, Building the Kingship of Christ, recognizes the 100th Anniversary of the establishment of The Feast of Christ the King as the "antidote to secularism—[secularism] a way of life which leaves God out of man's thinking and living and organizes his life as if God did not exist."
