Dear Faithful,

Today, we take up a <u>second collection to support</u> the International Seminary of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest, which is the seminary for all future priests of the Institute.

The seminary, a 17th century villa, was built for the Martelli Family as a summer home, and following the death of the last two daughters of the family, was transformed within the last 30 years into a seminary. Located 10 miles outside of Florence, Italy, only a few hours from the Eternal City, seminarians are immersed in the traditional formation that formed priests for millennia in prayer, study, and manual labor.

Our seminary is supported financially only by these second collections, seminary tuition, and our generous donors. There are nearly 100 seminarians of the Institute and each is not always able to offset the costs of his formation.

Please continue to keep these young men in your daily prayers as they thank you for your prayerful and financial support.
