 Please reserve parking in front of the church for those with difficulty walking.



How fortunate is that soul who is willing to have a great deal of tribulation before departing from this life! How can one possibly learn how to love deeply and sincerely if not among the spines, the

crosses and the feeling of abandonment over a long period? Our dear Savior thus proved his limitless love in the agony of His passion. Learn well how to love Christ on the bed of sorrow; on this bed He formed your heart before creating it, foreseeing it in His divine plan. Yes the Savior has numbered all your sorrows and all your sufferings. He has paid for them with His blood, with all the patience and love that is necessary. Be satisfied, therefore, to accept generously all that God has in store for you.



As a sacrificial prayer, this Office is very closery linked to the offering of the Most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, stemming from the evening sacrifice of Christ on the Cross and the offering of the Last Supper, the fulfillment of the old Jewish Temple sacrifices. <u>At Vespers we offer up to</u> <u>God, not the Bread of Heaven as the Body and Blood of</u> <u>Christ under the appearance of bread and wine, but rather</u> <u>the Bread of Heaven as the word that proceeds from the</u> <u>mouth of God</u> (cf Mt. 4:4).

In honor of the Heavenly Prince of the Angels, we're headed to the heavens of Tucson <u>after the High Mass</u>.


Bring lawn chairs, outdoor games, etc. as we plan to be there until past the beautiful sunset!

Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT: Ps. 73: 20, 19, 23, 1 Have regard, O Lord, to thy covenant, and forsake not to the end the souls of Thy poor: arise, O Lord, and judge Thy cause, and forget not the voices of them that seek Thee. (Ps) O God, why hast Thou cast us off unto the end: why is Thy wrath enkindled against the sheep of Thy pasture. Glory be. Have regard...

COLLECT: Almighty and everlasting God, give to us an increase of Faith, Hope, and Charity: and that we may deserve to obtain what Thou dost promise, make us love what Thou dost command. Through our Lord...

EPISTLE: Gal. 3: 16-22 Brethren: To Abraham were the promises made, and to his seed. He saith not: And to his seeds, as of many; but as of one: And to thy seed, which is Christ. Now this I say, that the testament which was confirmed by God, the law which was made after four hundred and thirty years, doth not disannul, to make the promise of no effect. For if the inheritance be of the law, it is no more of promise. But God gave it to Abraham by promise. Why then was the law? It was set because of transgressions until the seed should come, to whom He made the promise, being ordained by angels in the hand of a mediator. Now a mediator is not of one, but God is one. Was the law then against the promises of God? God forbid. For if there had been a law given, which could give life, verily justice should have been by the law. But the Scripture hath concluded all under sin, that the promise by the faith of Jesus Christ might be given to them that believe.

GRADUAL: Ps. 73: 20, 19, 22 Have regard, O Lord, to thy covenant, and forsake not to the end the souls of Thy poor. Arise, O Lord, and judge Thy cause: remember the reproach of Thy servants.

ALLELUIA: *Ps. 89:* **1** Alleluia, alleluia. Lord, Thou hast been our refuge, from generation to generation. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Lk. 17: 11-19 At that time, as Jesus was going to Jerusalem, He passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee: and as He entered into a certain town, there met Him ten men that were lepers, who stood afar off, and lifted up their voice, saying: Jesus, Master, have mercy on us. Whom when He saw, He said: Go, show yourselves to the priests. And it came to pass, that, as they went, they were made clean. And one of them, when he saw that he was made clean, went back, with a loud voice glorifying God: and he fell on his face before His feet, giving thanks: and this was a Samaritan. And Jesus answering said: Were not ten made clean? And where are the nine? There is no one found to return and give glory to God, but this stranger. And He said to him: Arise, go thy way; for thy faith hath made thee whole.
