NEXT SUNDAY, OCT 30-CYCLOVIA

Cyclovia is a "community event" promoting bicycling in neighborhoods and which then blocks off streets in the neighborhood around the church from 7:00 am until 4:00pm. Cars are NOT permitted on the streets designated for Cyclovia.

Dunbar Pavilion (north of the church) will be a terminal hub for the event; **Expect traffic to be increased around the church**. NOTE: There will be an east-west "vehicle crossing" at Speedway and Main, but Main will be blocked off both north & south-bound (as well as 2nd St and 11th Ave to University).

- (2) A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory is granted each and every day from Nov 1 to Nov 8, those faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and there pray, if only mentally, for the departed (with the usual requirements).



Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT: Dan. 3: 31,29,35; Ps. 118:1 All that Thou hast done to us, O Lord, Thou hast done in true judgment: because we have sinned against Thee, and we have not obeyed Thy commandments: but give glory to Thy name, and deal with us according to the multitude of Thy mercy. (Psalm) Blessed are the undefiled in the way, who walk in the law of the Lord. Glory be. All that...

COLLECT: Be appeased, O Lord, we beseech Thee, and bestow on Thy faithful pardon and peace, cleansing them from every sin and letting them feel secure in Thy service. Through Our Lord.

EPISTLE: A letter from Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Ephesians Eph. 5: 15-21

Brethren: See how you walk circumspectly, not as unwise but as wise; redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Wherefore, become not unwise, but understanding what is the will of God. And be not drunk with wine, wherein is luxury: but be ye filled with the Holy Ghost, speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual canticles, singing and making melody in your hearts to the Lord: giving thanks always for all things, in the name of Our Lord Jesus Christ, to God and the Father; being subject one to another in the fear of Christ.

GRADUAL: Ps. 144: 15,16 The eyes of all hope in Thee, O Lord, and Thou givest them meat in due season. Thou openest Thy hand, and fillest every living creature with Thy blessing.

ALLELUIA: Alleluia, alleluia. My heart is ready, O God, my heart is ready: I will sing, and will give praise to Thee, my glory. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: In. 4: 46-53

† Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. John

At that time there was a certain ruler whose son was sick at Capharnaum. He having heard that Jesus was come from Judaea into Galilee, went to Him, and prayed Him to come down and heal his son; for he was at the point of death. Jesus therefore said to him: Unless you see signs and wonders, you believe not. The ruler saith to Him: Lord, come down before my son die. Jesus saith to him: Go thy way, thy son liveth. The man believed the word which Jesus said to him, and went his way. And as he was going down, his servants met him, and they brought word, saying that his son lived. He asked therefore of them the hour wherein he grew better. And they said to him: Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him. The father therefore knew that it was at the same hour that Jesus said to him: Thy son liveth; and himself believed, and his whole house.

OFFERTORY: Ps. 136: 1 Upon the rivers of Babylon there we sat and wept when we remembered thee, O Sion.

SECRET: May these mysteries, we beseech Thee, O Lord, provide us with a heavenly remedy; and purge our hearts from their vices. Through Our Lord.

COMMUNION: Ps. 118: 49-50 Be Thou mindful of Thy word to Thy servant, O Lord, in which Thou hast given me hope: this hath comforted me in my humiliation.

POSTCOMMUNION: Make us worthy of Thy sacred gifts, we beseech Thee, O Lord, by keeping us always obedient to Thy commandments. Through Our Lord.
