VERITATEM FACIENTES IN CARITATE - LIVING THE TRUTH IN CHARITY

Preparatory Novena for the Immaculate Conception ~ November 29th to December 7th



We will soon turn our attention to prepare for the solemn Novena in honor of the Immaculate Conception from November 29 through December 7. This Novena will culminate on December 8 with the renewal of our total consecration to Mary Immaculate. This Novena's history goes far back: the ancient fourth century Roman Basilica of the Holy Apostles, having been destroyed during the first half of the 15th century by an earthquake, was rebuilt in the 15th century and entrusted to the

care of the Conventual Franciscans in 1474. In 1476, when the Feast of the Conception of Mary was extended to the Universal church, the Franciscans, glorious defenders of the privilege of the Immaculate since the scholastic age, resolved to prepare for the celebration of the feast by a solemn novena at the Basilica. From the early 18th century, the custom has been for a cardinal or another Roman prelate to come each night of the novena to preach and celebrate Solemn Benediction. We also will celebrate the Novena in the same spirit, and will also sing the beautiful ancient Marian hymn *Tota Pulchra es.* Sung Compline will close each evening of the novena.

Special Mass Schedule during the Novena, Nov 29 - Dec 7

To facilitate and encourage higher attendance for the whole family during this novena, Mass will be in the evening on **weekdays**.

Nov 29 - Dec 1: 6pm Low Mass w/ Sermon on Our Lady, followed by Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament and Novena Devotions, and closing with Sung Compline

1st Fri, Dec 2: 12pm Low Mass followed by Adoration, 5:30pm Novena Devotions & Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament, 6pm High Mass w/ Sermon on Our Lady, and closing with Sung Compline

1st Sat, Dec 3: **8am High Mass w/ Sermon** on Our Lady, **9:30am** First Saturday Morning Retreat, **10:00am** Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament, Holy Rosary, Novena Devotions & Meditation, and closing with Benediction

1st Sun, Dec 4: (<u>Regular Mass Times</u>) - **10:30am Solemn High Mass w/ Sermon** on Our Lady, followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Novena Devotions, **6pm Solemn Vespers**

Dec 5 - 7: 6pm Low Mass w/ Sermon on Our Lady, followed by Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament and Novena Devotions, and closing with Sung Compline

Last Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT: Jer. 29: 11, 12, 14; Ps. 84:2

The Lord saith: I think thoughts of peace, and not of affliction: you shall call upon Me, and I will hear you; and I will bring back your captivity from all places. (Ps) Lord, Thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob. Glory be. The Lord saith: I think...

COLLECT: O Lord, stir up the wills of the faithful that they may be more eager to seek the fruits of divine grace, and to discover in Your mercy greater healing for their sinfulness. Through Our Lord . . .

EPISTLE: Col. 1; 9-14

Brethren: Therefore we also, from the day that we heard it, cease not to pray for you and to beg that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will, in all wisdom and spiritual understanding: That you may walk worthy of God, in all things pleasing; being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God: Strengthened with all might according to the power of his glory, in all patience and long-suffering with joy, giving thanks to God the Father, who hath made us worthy to be partakers of the lot of the saints in light: Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness and hath translated us into the kingdom of the Son of his love, in whom we have redemption through his blood, the remission of sins.

GRADUAL: Psalm 43:8-9

Thou hast delivered us, O Lord, from them that afflict us: and hast put them to shame that hate us. V.: In God we will glory all the day: and in Thy Name we will give praise for ever.

ALLELUIA: Alleluia, alleluia. V. (Psalm 129:1, 2). From the depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my prayer. Alleluia

GOSPEL: *Matt.* 24; 15-35

At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "When therefore you shall see the abomination of desolation, which was spoken of by Daniel the prophet, standing in the holy place: he that readeth let him understand. Then they that are in Judea, let them flee to the mountains: And he that is on the housetop, let him not come down to take any thing out of his house: And he that is in the field, let him not go back to take his coat.

And woe to them that are with child and that give suck in those days. But pray that your flight be not in the winter or on the sabbath. For there shall be then great tribulation, such as hath not been from the beginning of the world until now, neither shall be. And unless those days had been shortened, no flesh should be saved: but for the sake of the elect those days shall be shortened."Then if any man shall say to you, 'Lo here is Christ,' or 'there': do not believe him. For there shall arise false Christs and false prophets and shall shew great signs and wonders, insomuch as to deceive (if possible) even the elect. Behold I have told it to you, beforehand. If therefore they shall say to you, 'Behold he is in the desert': go ye not out. 'Behold he is in the closets': believe it not. For as lightning cometh out of the east and appeareth even into the west: so shall also the cowling of the Son of man be. Wheresoever the body shall be, there shall the eagles also be gathered together."And immediately after the tribulation of those days, the sun shall be darkened and the moon shall not give her light and the stars shall fall from heaven and the powers of heaven shall be moved. And then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven. And then shall all tribes of the earth mourn: and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with much power and majesty. And he shall send his angels with a trumpet and a great voice: and they shall gather together his elect from the four winds, from the farthest parts of the heavens to the utmost bounds of them. "And from the fig tree learn a parable: When the branch thereof is now tender and the leaves come forth, you know that summer is nigh. So you also, when you shall see all these things, know ye that it is nigh, even at the doors. Amen I say to you that this generation shall not pass till all these things be done. Heaven and earth shall pass: but my words shall not pass."
