taken out of my breast and in its place the adorable heart of my God! But since we must not desire such extraordinary things, I can at least desire that my poor heart may beat no longer, except in obedience to the heart of Jesus. This would be enough to imitate Saint Catherine, and I would be gentle, humble and charitable, seeing that the heart of our Savior has no laws more loving that those of gentleness, humility and charity.



THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

INTROIT: Ps. 65: 1,2,3 Shout with joy to God, all the earth, alleluia: sing ye a psalm to His name, alleluia: give glory to His praise, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. (Ps) Say unto God: How terrible are Thy works, O Lord! In the multitude of Thy strength Thine enemies shall lie to Thee. Glory be. Shout with joy...

COLLECT

O God, Who to those that go astray dost show the light of Thy truth, that they may return to the path of justice: grant that all who are enrolled in the Christian faith may both spurn all that is hostile to that name and follow after what is fitting to it. Through Our Lord.

EPISTLE: I Pet. 2: 11-19

Lesson from the First Letter of St. Peter

Dearly beloved: I beseech you, as strangers and pilgrims, to refrain yourselves from carnal desires, which war against the soul, having your conversation good among the Gentiles: that whereas they speak against you as evildoers, they may, by the good works which they shall behold in you, glorify God in the day of visitation. Be ye subject therefore to every human creature for God's sake: whether it be to the king as excelling, or to governors as sent by him for the punishment of evildoers and for the praise of the good: for so is the will of God, that by doing well you may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men: as free, and not as making liberty a cloak for malice, but as the servants of God. Honor all men: love the brotherhood: fear God: honor the king. Servants, be subject to your masters with all fear, not only to the good and gentle, but also to the froward. For this is thankworthy before God: in Christ Jesus Our Lord.

PASCHAL ALLELUIA: Alleluia, alleluia. The Lord hath sent redemption to His people.

Alleluia. It behooved Christ to suffer and to rise again from the dead, and so to enter into His glory. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Jn. 16: 16-22 +Continuation of the Holy Gospel according to St. John

At that time Jesus said to His disciples: A little while, and now you shall not see Me: and again a little while, and you shall see Me: because I go to the Father. Then some of His disciples said one to another: What is this that He saith to us: A little while, and you shall not see Me: and again a little while, and you shall see Me, and, because I go to the Father? They said therefore: What is this that He saith, A little while? We know not what He speaketh. And Jesus knew that they had a mind to ask Him. And He said to them: Of this do you inquire among yourselves, because I said: A little while, and you shall not see Me: and again a little while, and you shall see Me? Amen, amen, I say to you, that you shall lament and weep, but the world shall rejoice: and you shall be made sorrowful, but your sorrow shall be turned into joy. A woman, when she is in labor, hath sorrow, because her hour is come: but when she hath brought forth the child, she remembereth no more the anguish, for joy that a man is born into the world. So also you now indeed have sorrow: but I will see you again and your heart shall rejoice: and your joy no man shall take from you.

OFFERTORY: Ps. 145: 2 Praise the Lord, O my soul: in my life I will praise the Lord: I will sing to my God as long as I shall be, alleluia.

SECRET: Grant, O Lord, by these mysteries, that checking our earthly longings, we may learn to love heavenly things. Through Our Lord.

PREFACE FOR EASTER and EASTERTIDE: It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, at all times to praise Thee, O Lord, but more gloriously at this time above others when Christ our Pasch was sacrificed. For He is the true Lamb Who took away the sins of the world: Who by dying destroyed our death, and by rising again hath restored us to life. And therefore with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominations, and with all the hosts of the heavenly army, we sing a hymn to Thy glory, evermore saying:

COMMUNION: Jn. 16: 16 A little while, and you shall not see Me, alleluia; and again a little while, and you shall see Me, because I go to the Father, alleluia, alleluia.

POSTCOMMUNION: May the Sacraments which we have received, we beseech Thee, O Lord, renew us with spiritual refreshment and defend us with bodily help. Through Our Lord.

INTROIT Sap. 10:17 Wisdom rendered to the just the wages of their labors and conducted them in a wonderful way; and she was for them a protection by day and the light of the stars by night, alleluia, alleluia! *Ps.* 126:1. Unless the Lord build the house, they labor in vain who build it. V. Glory Be . . .

COLLECT O God, the Creator of all things, Who hast imposed on all men the obligation of work: may the example and prayer of blessed Joseph help us to accomplish the tasks Thou dost command of us to perform, so that we may attain the reward Thou hast promised. Through Our Lord . . .

EPISTLE Col. 3:14-15, 17, 23-24. Brethren: have charity, which is the bond of perfection. And let the peace of Christ rejoice in your



hearts, wherein also you are called in one body. Show yourselves thankful. Whatsoever you do in word or in work, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, giving thanks to God and the Father by Him. Whatsoever you do, do it from the heart, as to the Lord, and not to men: Knowing that you shall receive of the Lord the reward of inheritance. Serve ye the Lord Christ.

PASCHAL ALLELUIA Ps. 36:39, 40, 28 Alleluia, alleluia! V. In whatever tribulation they shall cry to Me, I will hear them and be their protector always.

Alleluia! V. Obtain for us, Joseph, grace to lead an innocent life, that we may always be protected by thy patronage. Alleluia!


GOSPEL Matt. 13:54-58 At that time, when Jesus had come into His own country, He taught them in their synagogues, so that they wondered and said: "How came this man by this wisdom and miracles? Is not this the carpenter's son? Is not His mother called Mary, and His brethren James, and Joseph, and Simon, and Jude: And his sisters, are they not all with us? Whence therefore hath He all these things?" And they were scandalized in His regard. But Jesus said to them: "A prophet is not without honor, save in his own country, and in his own house." And He wrought not many miracles there, because of their unbelief.
