



Scapular Promise:

"Whosever dies in this garment shall not suffer eternal fire."

Our Lady to St. Simon Stock on July 16, 1251

Why enrollment?

To be eligible for the *Scapular Promise*, one must be enrolled in the Brown Scapular Confraternity to become an affiliated member of the Carmelite Order.

They also participate in the spiritual benefits, merits, and prayers of the entire Carmelite Order.

Sabbatine Privilege:

Appearing to Pope John XXII, Our Lady said: "I, the Mother of Grace, shall descend on the Saturday after their death and whomsoever I shall find in purgatory I shall free so that I may lead them to the holy mountain of life everlasting."

The Blessed Virgin attached the following conditions:

- 1. Wear the Brown Scapular continuously.
- 2. Observe chastity according to one's state in life (single or married)
- 3. Sabbatine Privilege Recite daily the *Little Office of the Blessed Virgin* **OR** with explicit permission of a priest, recite daily five decades of Our Lady's Most Holy Rosary.

Practical Tips about the Scapular:

- 1) The Scapular must be worn around the neck.
- 2) One has to be enrolled only once in the Confraternity.
- 3) Worn-out Scapulars are to be burned or buried. When one acquires a new Scapular, there is no need to have it blessed and no need to be re-enrolled.
- 4) St. Pius X approved the Scapular Medal for those in torrid climates and for those with sensitive skin (with same spiritual benefits as the Scapular of cloth).

The Scapular & Rosary go hand-in-hand....

English Translation of the Blessing and Enrollment in the Brown Scapular

Priest - Show us, O Lord, Thy mercy. Respondent - And grant us Thy salvation.

P - Lord, hear my prayer.

R - And let my cry come unto Thee.

P - The Lord be with you.

R - And with your Spirit.

P - Lord Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, sanctify + by Thy power these scapulars, which for love of Thee and for love of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Thy servants will wear devoutly, so that through the intercession of the same Virgin Mary, Mother of God, and protected against the evil spirit, they persevere until death in Thy grace. Thou who livest and reignest world without end. Amen.

THE PRIEST SPRINKLES WITH HOLY WATER THE SCAPULAR AND THE PERSON(S) BEING ENROLLED. HE THEN INVESTS HIM (THEM), SAYING:

P - Receive this blessed scapular and beseech the Blessed Virgin that through Her merits, you may wear it without stain. May it defend you against all adversity and accompany you to eternal life. Amen.

AFTER INVESTITURE THE PRIEST CONTINUES WITH THE PRAYERS:

P - I, by the power vested in me, admit you to participate in all the spiritual benefits obtained through the mercy of Jesus Christ by the Religious Order of Mount Carmel. In the name of the Father + and of the Son + and of the Holy Ghost. + Amen.

May God Almighty, the Creator of Heaven and earth, bless + you, He who has deigned to join you to the Confraternity of the Blessed Virgin of Mount Carmel; we beseech Her to crush the head of the ancient serpent so that you may enter into possession of your eternal heritage through Christ our Lord. R - Amen.

THE PRIEST THEN SPRINKLES AGAIN WITH HOLY WATER THE PERSON(S) ENROLLED.




Thought from St. Francis de Sales:

Why should I worry whether God prefers that I say the rosary or the office of Our Lady? There are not such great differences between the two as to require a long inquiry. The same applies to questions such as: Should I go to the hospital to visit the sick

rather than attend Vespers? Should I go to hear a sermon rather than visit an indulgenced church? Ordinarily, there is no greater importance in one than the other, nor need for lengthy deliberation. We must proceed in good faith and without making subtle distinctions in such affairs. Do freely what seems good at the moment, and do not worry your mind or waste your time!

Seventh Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT: Ps. 46: 2,3 Clap your hands, all ye nations: shout unto God with the voice of joy. (Psalm) For the Lord is high, He is terrible: a great King over all the earth. Glory be. Clap your hands, all ye nations:...

COLLECT: O God, Whose providence faileth not in its designs, we humbly entreat Thee: put from us all that might be harmful and give us all that will be profitable. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Rom. 6: 19-23 Brethren: I speak a human thing, because of the infirmity of your flesh; for as you have yielded your members to serve uncleanness and iniquity unto iniquity, so now yield your members to serve justice unto sanctification. For when you were the servants of sin, you were free men to justice. What fruit therefore had you then in those things, of which you are now ashamed? For the end of them is death. But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, you have your fruit unto sanctification, and the end life everlasting. For the wages of sin is death. But the grace of God is life everlasting; in Christ Jesus Our Lord.

GRADUAL: Ps. 33: 12, 6 Come, children, hearken to me; I will teach you the fear of the Lord. Come ye to Him and be enlightened; and your faces shall not be confounded.

ALLELUIA: Ps. 46 2 Alleluia, alleluia. O clap your hands, all ye nations, shout unto God with the voice of joy. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Mt. 7: 15–21 At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: Beware of false prophets, who come to you in the clothing of sheep, but inwardly they

are ravening wolves. By their fruits you shall know them. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit, and the evil tree bringeth forth evil fruit. A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can an evil tree bring forth good fruit. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit, shall be cut down, and shall be cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits you shall know them. Not every one that saith to Me: Lord, Lord, shall enter into the Kingdom of heaven: but he that doeth the will of My Father Who is in heaven, he shall enter into the Kingdom of heaven.

OFFERTORY: Dan. 3: 40 As in holocausts of rams and bullocks, and as in thousands of fat lambs; so let our sacrifice be made in Thy sight this day, that is may please Thee: for there is no confusion to them that trust in Thee, O Lord.

SECRET: O God, Who hast justified the variety of sacrifices of the Law by the perfection of this one Sacrifice: accept the Sacrifice of Thy servants who are dedicated to Thee, and sanctify it with a blessing like to that which Thou didst bestow upon the gifts of Abel: that what each one of us has offered to the honor of Thy Majesty, may profit us all unto salvation. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION: Ps. 30: 3 Bow down Thine ear, make haste to deliver me.

POSTCOMMUNION: May Thy healing work, O Lord, both mercifully free us from all our waywardness and lead us to all this is right. Through our Lord.
