## **ADVENT EMBER DAYS**

The Advent Ember Days take place this Wednesday, December 20<sup>th</sup>, Friday, December 22<sup>nd</sup> and Saturday, December 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Ember Days are traditionally days of fasting and abstinence. Though the current Code of Canon Law does not demand that we fast, we are still encouraged to do so. Monsignor Wach has repeatedly encouraged the Institute canons and oblates to fast for the benefit of Holy Mother Church in these trying times. The minimum of the fast includes 2 small snacks and 1 meatless meal.

'The intentions, which the Church has in the fast of the Ember days, are the same as those of the Synagogue; namely, to consecrate to God by penance the four seasons of the year. [....] We must never forget that although the interior preparation is what is absolutely essential for our profiting by the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, yet this preparation could scarcely be real unless it manifested itself by the exterior practices of religion and penance.' # THOUGHT FROM ST. FRANCIS DE SALES



We always want this thing or that thing, and even when we have Jesus Himself in our breast we are not satisfied. Yet He is all that we could possibly desire...At the birth of the Savior the shepherds heard the songs of the heavenly spirits, but Sacred Scripture does not say that they were heard by the Madonna and Saint Joseph, who were closer to the little Babe. Instead, they saw the Divine Child trembling with the cold, His eyes bathed in tears! And what do we prefer—to stay in that dark stable

which echoes with the cries of the Babe, or to be outside listening with the shepherds to the angelic choirs? Certainly we should choose the former, because it is better, even in the darkness to stay close to Jesus. (Letters 359; O. XIII, pp. 202-203)

# THE OANTIPHONS

Commentary by Dom Prosper Gueranger

The seven days, which precede the Vigil of Christmas, [...] are known in the Liturgy under the name of the *Greater Ferias*. The ordinary of the Advent Office becomes more solemn; the Antiphons of the Psalms, both for Lauds and the Hours of the day, are proper, and allude expressly to the great Coming. Every day, at Vespers, is sung a solemn Antiphon, which consists of a fervent prayer to the Messias, whom it addresses by one of the titles given him by the sacred Scriptures.

The canonical Hour of Vespers has been selected as the most appropriate time for this solemn supplication to our Saviour, because, as the Church sings in one of her hymns, it was in the Evening of the world (vergente mundi vespere) that the Messias came amongst us. These Antiphons are sung at the Magnificat, to show us that the Saviour, whom we expect, is to come to us by Mary. They are sung twice; once before and once after the Canticle, as on Double Feasts, and this to show their great solemnity. ... Lastly, these admirable Antiphons, which contain the whole pith of the Advent Liturgy, are accompanied by a chant replete with melodious gravity, and by ceremonies of great expressiveness, though, in these latter, there is no uniform practice followed. Let us enter into the spirit of the Church; let us reflect on the great Day which is coming; that thus we may take oar share in these the last and most earnest solicitations of the Church imploring her Spouse to come, and to which He at length yields.

Henceforth, I desire to serve Thee with fidelity and, for the love of Thee, O Divine Infant, I will love my neighbor as myself. All powerful Infant, O Jesus, I implore Thee again, assist me in this need. Grant me the grace of possessing Thee eternally with Mary and Joseph and of adoring Thee with the angels in the heavenly court. Amen.

- Dec. 17 **O** Wisdom, \* which came out of the mouth of the Most High, and reachest from one end to another, mightily and sweetly ordering all things: Come and teach us the way of prudence.
- Dec. 18 **O** Adonai, \* and Leader of the house of Israel, who appearedst in the Bush to Moses in a flame of fire, and gavest him the Law of Sinai: Come and redeem us with an outstretched arm.
- Dec. 19 **O Root of Jesse**, \* which standest for an ensign of the people, at whom kings shall shut their mouths, to whom the Gentiles shall seek: Come and deliver us, and tarry not.
- Dec. 20 **O** Key of David, \* and Sceptre of the house of Israel; that openest and no man shutteth, and shuttest and no man openeth: Come and bring the prisoners out of the prison-house, them that sit in darkness and the shadow of death.
- Dec. 21 **O Dayspring**, \* Brightness of Light Everlasting, and Sun of Righteousness: Come and enlighten them that sit in darkness and the shadow of death.
- Dec. 22 **O** King of the Nations, \* and their Desire; the Cornerstone who makest both one: Come and save mankind, whom Thou formedst of clay.
- Dec. 23 **O Emmanuel**, \* our King and Lawgiver, Desire of all nations and their Salvation: Come and save us, O Lord our God.

#### Each day after the corresponding "O" Antiphon:

- V. Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the skies pour down righteousness.
- R. Let the earth open, and bring forth a Savior.

#### During 3rd Week of Advent:

Let us pray. Incline Thine ear, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to our prayers: and make bright the darkness of our minds by the grace of Thy visitation. Who livest and reignest, world without end. R. Amen.

#### During 4th Week of Advent:

Let us pray. Stir up, we beseech Thee, O Lord, Thy power, and come; make haste to our aid with Thy great might; that, by the help of Thy grace, that which is hindered by our sins may be hastened by Thy merciful forgiveness. Who livest and reignest, world without end. R. Amen.
