THOUGHT FROM ST. FRANCIS DE SALES

My God, the birth of the Lord gives rise to a thousand thoughts and affections in our hearts! Never could there have been a poorer or a happier birth, nor at the same time a more radiant and happy mother! Saint Paula preferred to live as a pilgrim in Bethlehem than as a society lady

in Rome, being convinced that day and night in this hospice where she was staying she could hear the cries of the little Savior in the crib. As Saint Francis of Assisi used to say of little Infant of Bethlehem, He inspired him to despise greatness and earthly ambitions, summoning him back to the sublime love of abjection. (Letters 1864; O. XX, p. 212)



Dear Faithful,

This Christmas we celebrate the 800th anniversary of St. Francis of Assisi's live Nativity Scene in Greccio, Italy in 1223. Though some other forms of this devotion may have existed elsewhere, it is thanks to his impetus that the Nativity Scene has now become synonymous in Western Civilization with Christmas. He wanted to see with his own eyes the humble and poor conditions in which the "Child of Bethlehem" was born in our midst. Having just received approbation of his Rule in November 1223 from Pope Honorius III, returning to Umbria, Francis wanted to immerse himself in Our Lord's hidden life and in the poverty of His miraculous birth. With St. Francis, this Christmas, let us gaze upon what is the most important: the birth of the God-Man, come to save us from our sin. True joy and happiness can only come from Christ as He alone can bring us God's forgiveness.

This week we will close the "Year of St. Francis de Sales" that we began on the 400th anniversary of his death and passage to Eternal Life. The "Doctor of Charity" and the "Gentlemen's Saint" offers each one of us so much spiritual nourishment in his writings for our daily life. I hope that you used this year to profit from his holy wisdom and spiritual teachings just as much applicable to us now as to people of his day. The "works of modern culture" are ugly and modern man is very lonely, angry, and depressed and thus St. Francis is the perfect Saint for our times as He presents God's truths to us in a way that is beautiful, delightful and filled with hope.

May St. Francis of Assisi and St. Francis de Sales be your holy guides bringing you to the eternal joy, love, and happiness of the Divine Infant King!

Novena in Preparation for the Feast of Our Lord's Nativity

Prayer to the Infant King

O Divine Infant Jesus, I have recourse to Thee. Please, through Thy Blessed Mother, assist me in this necessity ...mention intention..., because I firmly believe that Thy Divinity can help me. I hope with confidence to obtain Thy holy grace. I love Thee with all my heart and with all the strength of my soul. I repent sincerely of my sins and I beg Thee, O Good Jesus, to grant me the strength to triumph over them. I resolve never more to offend Thee and I come to offer myself to Thee with the intention of enduring everything rather than to displease Thee. Henceforth, I desire to serve Thee with fidelity and, for the love of Thee, O Divine Infant, I will love my neighbor as myself.

All-powerful Infant, O Jesus, I implore Thee again, assist me in this need. Grant me the grace of possessing Thee eternally with Mary and Joseph and of adoring Thee with the angels in the Heavenly Court. Amen.

The Great O's

December 17th - O Wisdom, * which camest out of the mouth of the Most High, and reachest from one end to another, mightily and sweetly ordering all things: Come and teach us the way of prudence.

December 18th - O Adonai, * and Leader of the house of Israel, who appearedst in the Bush to Moses in a flame of fire, and gavest him the Law of Sinai: Come and redeem us with an outstretched arm.

December 19th - O Root of Jesse, * which standest for an ensign of the people, at whom kings shall shut their mouths, to whom the Gentiles shall seek: Come and deliver us, and tarry not.

December 20th - O Key of David, * and Sceptre of the house of Israel; that openest and no man shutteth, and shuttest and no man openeth: Come and bring the prisoners out of the prisonhouse, them that sit in darkness and the shadow of death.

December 21st - O Dayspring, * Brightness of Light Everlasting, and Sun of Righteousness: Come and enlighten them that sit in darkness and the shadow of death.

December 22nd - O King of the Nations, * and their Desire; the Cornerstone who makest both one: Come and save mankind, whom thou formedst of clay.

December 23rd - O Emmanuel, * our King and Lawgiver, the Desire of all nations and their Salvation: Come and save us, O Lord our God.

Each day of the Novena, after the corresponding "O" Antiphon: V. Roráte, cæli, désuper, et nubes pluant justum. R. Aperiátur terra, et gérminet Salvatórem.

During 3rd Week of Advent:

Oremus.

Aurem tuam, quæsumus, Dómine, précibus nostris accómmoda: et mentis nostræ ténebras grátia tuæ visitatiónis illústra : Qui vivis et regnas in sæcula sæculórum. R. Amen.

During 4th Week of Advent: Oremus.

Excita, quæsumus, Dómine, poténtiam tuam, et veni : et magna nobis virtúte succúrre; ut per auxílium grátiæ tuæ, quod nostra peccáta præpédiunt, indulgéntia tuæ propitiatiónis accéleret : Qui vivis et regnas in sæcula sæculórum. *R.* Amen. *Each day of the Novena, after the corresponding "O" Antiphon: V*. Drop down, ye heavens, from above, and let the skies pour down righteousness.

R. Let the earth open, and bring forth a Savior.

During 3rd Week of Advent:

Let us pray.

Incline thine ear, we beseech thee, O Lord, to our prayers: and make bright the darkness of our minds by the grace of thy visitation. Who livest and reignest, world without end. *R.* Amen.

During 4th Week of Advent:

Let us pray.

Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, thy power, and come; make haste to our aid with thy great might ; that, by the help of thy grace, that which is hindered by our sins may be hastened by thy merciful forgiveness. Who livest and reignest, world without end. R. Amen.

Christmas Eve Antiphon and Prayer

December 24th - O Judah and Jerusalem, * fear not: tomorrow ye shall go out, and the Lord will be with you, alleluia.

V. Crástina die delébitur iníquitas terræ.

R. Et regnábit super nos Salvátor mundi.

Orémus.
