




Memorial Day: Monday 27<sup>th</sup>:

## What is a Votive Mass?

By *Votive Mass,* we mean a Mass said unrelated to the Office or the commemorations of the current day, which is not of a mystery or Saint having its eulogy in the Martyrology on this day.

There are three kinds of Votive Mass:

- **Ritual Masses**, for the celebration of certain Sacraments or liturgical Rite: *Election of a Pope*, *Coronation of the Pope*, *Consecration of a Bishop*, *Reception of Holy Orders*, *Marriage... and Funeral...*
- Masses for Various Needs... For the propagation of the Faith, to end Schism (for Church Unity), in time of War, for Peace, for avoidance of Mortality (during epidemic), asking special Grace from the Holy Ghost, for the forgiveness of sins, for Pilgrims, for the sicks, asking the Grace of a good death, in thanksgiving... or for any necessity

...& Occasions: asking for the Intercession of all Saints, for every Degree of the Church (do not forget that the Church is a pyramid...) for the Pope, for the Emperor, for the King, for the Prelates & their communities, for our community & family, for maintaining harmony in our community; against the persecutors of the Church, against the persecutors and those who act badly, in any necessity, in any tribulation, in time of famine, in time of earthquake, asking for rain, asking for serenity, to repel storms, against animal's epidemy, for the priest himself, asking for the gift of tears, for the forgiveness of sins (another one) for the public penitents, for those who are tempted, to repel bad thoughts, asking chastity, asking humility, asking patience, asking Charity, for the devout Friends, for our enemies, for prisoners & inmates , for sailors, for the Salvation of the living... and for the living and the dead.

**Masses of a Saint.** (Starting with the Mass of the Mysteries of Our Lord: *"Tu solus Sanctus..." only Thou is Saint...*) This kind is divided on two kinds: those which have a day assigned, and those which have not...

But I run out of space to go into those details (*so, complain to Canon if you want him to give me more room...*); see you next week.
