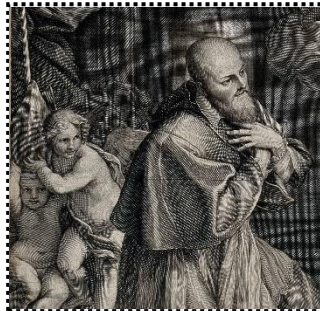

**5:30pm: Vespers,** followed with the fire's blessing... Followed by a merry & joyful time around it...

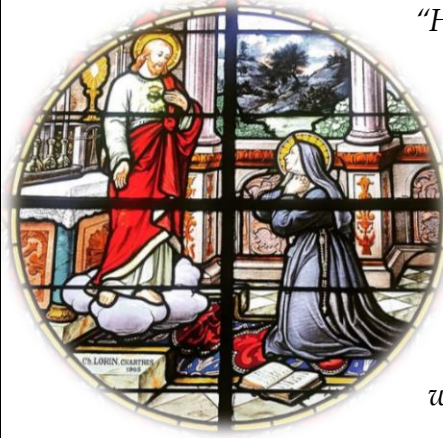

St. Francis de Sales has been "to the school of Jesus meek and humble of heart".

Just a few quotes that say a lot:

"O God, if we received the heavenly inspirations to the full extent of their virtue, in a short time we would make great progress in holiness!"



"How good is the Lord, how lovable his Heart! Let us follow him into this holy abode. May this Heart always live in our hearts"
