## Tarcisius' teaching.

On Tuesday, July 16<sup>th</sup>, feast day of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, those who desire it will be enrolled in the Society & Confraternity of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary of the Mount Carmel, after the morning Mass.

Beforehand, just a few reminders:

- We can be enrolled only once and for all. Once enrolled, we must pray daily the Little Office of Our Lady, (St. Pius V gave power to any priest imposing the Scapulary, to commute this somewhat difficult obligation, for example by daily recitation of the rosary...)
- We must wear the Brown Scapulary, days & nights, worthily. (St. Pius X allowed to replace it with the medal of Our Lady of the Mount Carmel, for a sufficiently good reason).
- If we need to replace our scapulary (because of wear and tear of time) since it is a vestment all the others you will wore are blessed with the first one (as cassocks or surplices...)

While giving her Scapulary to St. Simon Stock, Our Lady made theses promises:

- To be preserved of hell, under the condition of having received the Scapular with right intention, and to wear it worthily at the time of our death.
- To be delivered from purgatory, the Saturday following death, if we usually:
  - wear the Scapular,
  - maintain the chastity of one's state of life,
  - recite the Little Office of the Blessed Virgin daily (or whatever prayers imposed at the time of the enrollment.)

## Trivia Question:

What were the lasts words of St. Simon Stock?

When St Simon Stock died on May 16<sup>th</sup>, 1265, at the age of 100 years old, in Bordeaux (France), his last words were: "Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death."  
The Catholic Church loved it so much that she took them and added them to the Angel & Elizabeth's Salutation...
