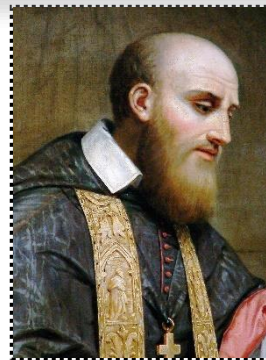

Papal Audience.



On June 24, on the occasion of the 45th anniversary of his priestly ordination by St. John Paul II, Msgr. Wach, prior general of our Institute, was received in a private audience

by his holiness Pope Francis, accompanied by Msgr. Schmitz, his vicar general, and Canon Valadier, provincial of France.

This audience was an opportunity to thank the Holy Father for his beautiful letter *Totum amoris* dedicated to St. Francis de Sales, our patron saint. Msgr. Wach then presented all the pastoral work provided by the priests of the Institute throughout the world in the service of souls. On two occasions, the Pope insisted that we continue to serve the Church according to our own charism, in this spirit of unity and communion that the harmony and balance of the Salesian spirit allow. The Holy Father also expressed his gratitude for the prayers and the apostolic and missionary work of the Sisters Adorers, as well as the generous dedication of the Oblates.

At the end of the audience, the Holy Father invited our Superior General to visit him again with all the members of the Institute as well as the sisters whom he will gladly receive in audience.

Tarcisius' teaching: Benefits of the Scapular:

The first privilege enjoyed by each wearer of the Mount Carmel scapular is membership in the great Carmelite family. He receives all the graces and all the fruits obtained through the prayers and sacrifices offered by all the members. He is assured of his final perseverance thanks to the constant mediation of Mary throughout his life and at the hour of his death. He must therefore always maintain unalterable confidence in the merciful goodness of the Mother of God who is also his Mother, and in her omnipotence, because she is Queen of Heaven.

The second privilege is called "sabbatin":

Among the many spiritual favors granted by the Church to those who wear the scapular, the most notable is the "sabbatin privilege". Its origin is the "Sabbatine Bulla" that Pope John XXII have granted in 1317, after being favored by a vision of the Queen of Carmel.

In his Bulla "Sacratissimo uti culmine" of March 3, 1322, John XXII refers to this apparition of the Blessed Virgin. He relates that after the death of Clement V, in 1322, during the long conclave that followed, the Virgin Mary appeared to Cardinal Jacques Duez. She announced to him that he would be elected pope and that he would take the name John XXII. She asked him to confirm the Rule of Carmel. She made the following promise to the Carmelites and to all those who, being part of the Carmelite Confraternity, would wear the scapular and keep the chastity according to their state of life. "If on the day of their passage into the other life, they (the children of Carmel) are brought to purgatory, I will go down there on the Saturday following their death and I will deliver those I find there and bring them back to the holy mountain and to eternal life."

Therefore, the Blessed Virgin promised to deliver from Purgatory, on the Saturday after their death, those who wore her Scapular.

Two conditions were set to benefit from this promise:

- the observation by the confreres of the chastity according to their state of life (complete in celibacy and conjugal in marriage),
- and the recitation of the Little Office of the Blessed Virgin. (Priests have the power to commute this somewhat difficult obligation: for example, by the daily recitation of the rosary.)
