Charter for the Protection of Children:

As a reminder, our Oratory follows the national guidelines for the protection of Children approved by the US Bishops and the policies of the Diocese of Worcester, in screening those who work with children in our care and in helping victims of abuse find healing.

If you are concerned about a case of abuse, please contact the local civil Authorities immediately.

Tarcisius' teaching: Benefits of the Scapulary.

In addition to the 3 main privileges, there are other benefits given to those who wear the scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

The first privilege enjoyed by each wearer of the Mount Carmel scapular is membership in the great Carmelite family. He receives all the graces and all the fruits obtained through the prayers and sacrifices offered by all the members.

The second privilege is to be assured of his final perseverance thanks to the constant mediation of Mary throughout his life and at the hour of his death.

The third privilege is the promise of Our Lady to deliver from Purgatory, on the Saturday after their death, those who wore her Scapular.

In addition to these privileges, the Church grants a plenary indulgence (remission of the full penalties due for our sins) to the Members of the Confraternity, on different occasions:

- the day on which one receives the Scapular for the first time
- on the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel (July 16th),
- of the holy prophet Elijah (July 20th),
- of St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus (October 1st),
- of St. Thérèse of Jesus (October 15th),
- of all the S^{ts} of the Order of Carmel (November 14th),
- of St. John of the Cross (November 24th),
- of St. Simon Stock (May 16th).

On these different days, one can gain this plenary indulgence provided that:

- confess within a week,
- receive communion the same day,
- pray for the Pope (at least an "Our Father", a "Hail Mary" & a "Glory be" ...).
- read holy scripture for at least half an hour or recite, without interruption, a Rosary in a church, taking the time to meditate on the mysteries
- exclusion of any attachment to sin, even venial (this means that one would prefer to die rather than deliberately commit a sin, even venial),

We must also have an integrity of life and a purity of morals which makes us worthy of the maternal protection and promises of the Blessed Virgin.
