TRINITY SUNDAY

Introit: *Tobias 12: 6.* Blessed be the holy Trinity, and undivided Unity: we will give glory to Him, because He hath shown His mercy to us. *Psalm 8: 2.* O Lord our Lord, how wonderful is Thy name in all the earth. Glory be. Blessed be the holy Trinity.

Collect: Almighty, eternal God, by Whose gift Thy servants, in the confession of the true faith, acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity, and adore the Unity in the power of His majesty, we beseech Thee that in the firmness of the same faith we may ever be defended from all adversities. Through our Lord.

Epistle: Romans 11: 33-36. O the depth of the riches of the wisdom and of the knowledge of God! How incomprehensible are His judgments, and how unsearchable His ways! For who hath known the mind of the Lord? Or who hath been His counsellor? Or who hath first given to Him, and recompense shall be made Him? For of Him, and by Him, and in Him, are all things: to Him be glory for ever. Amen.

Gradual: Daniel 3: 55, 56. Blessed art Thou, O Lord, Who beholdest the depths, and sittest upon the cherubim. V. Blessed art Thou, O Lord, in the firmament of heaven, and worthy of praise for ever. Alleluia, alleluia. V. Blessed art Thou, O Lord God of our fathers, and worthy of praise for ever. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. Matthew 28: 18-20.* At that time, Jesus said to His disciples, All power is given to Me in heaven and in earth. Going, therefore, teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you; and behold I am with you all days, even to the consummation of the world.

Offertory: *Tobias 12: 6.* Blessed be God the Father, and the only-begotten Son of God, and also the Holy Spirit; because He hath shown His mercy toward us.

Secret: By the invocation of Thy holy name, O Lord, our God, sanctify, we beseech Thee, the matter of this oblation, and through it make us ourselves a perfect offering forever. Through our Lord.

Preface of the Most Holy Trinity: It is truly meet and just, right and profitable, for us, at all times, and in all places, to give thanks to Thee, O Lord, the holy One, the Father almighty, the everlasting God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son and the Holy Ghost, art one God, one Lord, not in the singleness of one Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For that which, according to Thy revelation, we believe of Thy glory, the same we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or distinction; so that in the confession of one true and eternal Godhead we adore distinctness in persons, oneness in essence, and equality in majesty: Which the angels praise, and the archangels, the cherubim also and the seraphim, who cease not, day by day crying out with one voice: Holy, holy, holy.

Communion: *Tobias 12: 6.* We bless the God of heaven, and before all living we will praise Him; because He has shown His mercy to us.

Postcommunion: May the receiving of this sacrament, O Lord, our God, and the confession of our faith in the eternal, holy Trinity and undivided Unity, profit us for the health of body and soul. Through our Lord.

DIOCESAN APPROVED TRADITIONAL LATIN MASS APOSTOLATE

We welcome you today to St. Mary's Oratory!

If this is your first time here, we look forward to meeting you. During the summer, weather permitting, we meet at Oak Island Park after the 10:30 am High Mass. Please join us.

Holy Mass here is celebrated in the traditional Latin Rite. This was the form of worship in use in the Western world from antiquity until 1970. If you are unfamiliar with the traditional Latin Mass, do not hesitate to approach the priests with any questions you may have.

All practicing Catholics in the state of grace are invited to approach the altar rail for Holy Communion. In the traditional Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received kneeling (unless you are impaired from doing so) and on the tongue. The mouth should be open with the tongue slightly extended. You do not look at the priest and you do not say Amen.

The baptistery in the back of the church functions as a crying room during the Mass. Please feel free to make use of it when you have a crying child by exiting quietly down one of the side aisle.

If you are not Catholic, we invite you to learn about our faith. The Church was founded over 2000 years ago by Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. If you are interested in becoming Catholic or learning more about the Catholic faith, please do not hesitate to contact us. The priests of the Oratory offer individual instruction. We look forward to hearing from you.


