FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Introit: Psalm 26: 7-9. Hear, O Lord, my voice with which I have cried to Thee: be Thou my helper, forsake me not, nor do Thou despise me, O God my Saviour. Ps. 26: 1. The Lord is my light, and my salvation: whom shall I fear? Glory be. Hear, O Lord, my voice.

Collect: O God, Who hast prepared good things unseen for them that love Thee, pour into our hearts the fervor of Thy love, that, loving Thee in all things and above all things, we may attain Thy promises, which surpass all desire. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *I Peter 3:* 8-15. Dearly beloved, Be ye all of one mind, having compassion one of another, being lovers of the brotherhood, merciful, modest, humble: not rendering evil for evil, nor railing for railing, but contrariwise, blessing: for unto this are you called, that you may inherit a blessing. For he that will love life and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no guile. Let him decline from evil, and do good; let him seek after peace, and pursue it: because the eyes of the Lord are upon the just, and His ears unto their prayers, but the countenance of the Lord upon them that do evil things. And who is he that can hurt you, if you be zealous of good? But if also you suffer anything for justice' sake, blessed are ye. And be not afraid of their fear, and be not troubled; but sanctify the Lord Christ in your hearts.

Gradual: *Psalm 83: 10, 9.* Behold, O God our protector, and look on Thy servants. O Lord God of hosts, give ear to the prayers of Thy servants. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 20: 1.* In Thy strength, O Lord, the king shall joy; and in Thy salvation he shall rejoice exceedingly. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. Matthew 5: 20-24.* At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: Except your justice abound more than that of the Scribes and Pharisees, you shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. You have heard that it was said to them of old, Thou shalt not kill; and whosoever shall kill, shall be in danger of the judgment. But I say to you, that whosoever is angry with his brother, shall be in danger of the judgment; and whosoever shall say to his brother, Raca, shall be in danger of the council; and whosoever shall say, Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire. If therefore thou offer thy gift at the altar, and there thou remember that thy brother hath anything against thee, leave there thy offering before the altar, and go first to be reconciled to thy brother; and then coming thou shalt offer thy gift.

Offertory: *Psalm 15: 7, 8.* I will bless the Lord, Who hath given me understanding: I set God always in my sight; for He is at my right hand, that I be not moved.

Secret: Be propitiated, O Lord, by our supplications, and graciously accept these oblations of Thy servants and Thy handmaidens, that what each has offered to the honor of Thy name may profit for the salvation of all. Through our Lord.

Communion: *Psalm 26: 4.* One thing I have asked of the Lord, this will I seek after; that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life.

Postcommunion: Grant us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, whom Thou hast filled with the heavenly gift, that we be cleansed of our hidden sins and delivered from the snares of our enemies. Through our Lord.

Proper Attire in Church

Now that the warm summer weather is here, just a friendly reminder about the importance of coming to church decently attired. Although it can be tempting to dress with comfort primarily in mind, out of respect for God's house and out of consideration for the dignity of the human person, it is important to dress with modesty and decorum. Revealing or tight-fitting clothing does not meet the norms for Christian modesty, especially in church. Gentlemen are kindly asked not to wear shorts. Ladies and girls should wear skirts and dresses falling at least below the knee (no exposed backs or shoulders) and are encouraged to have their heads covered, keeping with the apostolic tradition.

Holy Mass here is celebrated in the traditional Latin Rite. This was the form of worship in use in the Western world from antiquity until 1970. If you are unfamiliar with the traditional Latin Mass, do not hesitate to approach the priests with any questions you may have.

All practicing Catholics in the state of grace are invited to approach the altar rail for Holy Communion. In the traditional Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received kneeling (unless you are impaired from doing so) and on the tongue. The mouth should be open with the tongue slightly extended. You do not look at the priest and you do not say Amen.

The baptistery in the back of the church functions as a crying room during the Mass. Please feel free to make use of it when you have a crying child by exiting quietly down one of the side aisle.

If you are not Catholic, we invite you to learn about our faith. The Church was founded over 2000 years ago by Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. If you are interested in becoming Catholic or learning more about the Catholic faith, please do not hesitate to contact us. The priests of the Oratory offer individual instruction. We look forward to hearing from you.
