FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY

Introit: *Proverbs 23: 24, 25.* Let the father of the Just rejoice greatly; let thy father and thy mother be joyful, and let her rejoice that bore thee. *Ps. 82: 2, 3.* How lovely are Thy tabernacles O Lord of hosts; my soul longeth and fainteth for the courts of the Lord. Glory be. Let the father of the Just.

Collect: O Lord Jesus Christ, Who, in the days of Thy subjection to Mary and Joseph, didst consecrate home life by ineffable acts of virtue; by the intercession of Thy holy Mother and of Thy foster Father, make us so to profit by the example they with Thee have set us, that we may be counted members of Thy household for evermore. Who livest.

Epistle: *Colossians 3: 12-17.* Brethren, put ye on, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, the bowels of mercy, benignity, humility, modesty, patience; bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if any have a complaint against another, even as the Lord hath forgiven you, so you also. But above all these things, have charity, which is the bond of perfection: and let the peace of Christ rejoice in your hearts, wherein also you are called in one body: and be ye thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you abundantly, in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another, in psalms, hymns, and spiritual canticles, singing in grace in your hearts to God. All whatsoever you do in word or in work, all things do ye in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, giving thanks to God and the Father through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Gradual: *Psalm 26: 4.* One thing I have asked of the Lord: this will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life. *Ps. 83: 5.* Blessed are they who dwell in Thy house, O Lord; they shall praise Thee for ever and ever. Alleluia, alleluia. *V. Isaias 45: 15.* Truly Thou art a hidden King, the God of Israel, the Saviour. Alleluia.

Gospel: Luke 2: 42-52. And when Jesus was twelve years old, they going up into Jerusalem according to the custom of the feast, and having fulfilled the days, when they returned, the child Jesus remained in Jerusalem; and His parents knew it not. And thinking that He was in the company, they came a day's journey, and sought Him among their kinsfolks and acquaintance. And not finding Him, they returned into Jerusalem, seeking Him. And it came to pass, that after three days they found Him in the temple sitting in the midst of the doctors, hearing them and asking them questions. And all that heard Him were astonished at His wisdom and His answers. And seeing Him, they wondered. And His mother said to Him, Son, why hast Thou done so to us? behold Thy father and I have sought Thee sorrowing. And He said to them, How is it that you sought Me? did you not know that I must be about My Father's business? And they understood not the word that He spoke unto them. And He went down with them, and came to Nazareth; and was subject to them. And His mother kept all these words in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom, and age, and grace with God and man.

Offertory: Luke 2: 22. The parents of Jesus carried Him to the temple, to present Him to the Lord.

Secret: To appease Thee, O Lord, we offer the Victim of Salvation, humbly beseeching Thee that, through the prayers of the Virgin Mother of God and of St. Joseph, Thou wouldst establish our households in Thy peace and favor. Through the same.

Communion: *Luke 2: 51.* Jesus went down with them, and came to Nazareth and was subject to them.

Postcommunion: Do Thou, O Lord, bring us whom Thou hast refreshed with heavenly mysteries to imitate the example of Thy holy Family, that at the hour of our death, with the Virgin Mother and blessed Joseph at hand, we may be received by Thee into our everlasting home. Who livest.

FOURTH CENTENARY OF ST. FRANCIS DE SALES

On December 28, 1622, the exiled bishop and prince of Geneva was serving on a diplomatic mission when he fell ill and died at the Monastery of the Visitation in Lyons, France. He was canonized in 1665 and proclaimed Doctor of the Universal Church in 1877. His feast was fixed on January 29.

The fourth centenary of his heavenly birthday is the occasion for us to prepare for his feast at the end of this month and dedicate this entire calendar year to the veneration, invocation, and imitation of the saint who is our spiritual master in the Institute of Christ the King.

The American Province will prepare for his feast with a novena from January 20-28. As his feast falls this year on a Sunday, we will be able to keep it with special solemnity.
