**EXTERNAL SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI**

**Introit:** *Psalm 80: 17.* He fed them with the fat of wheat, alleluia; and filled them with honey out of the rock, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 80: 2.* Rejoice to God our helper; sing aloud to the God of Jacob. Glory be. He fed them.

**Collect:** O God, Who in this wonderful sacrament hast left us a memorial of Thy passion, grant us, we beseech Thee, so to venerate the sacred mysteries of Thy body and blood that we may constantly experience in ourselves the fruit of Thy redemption. Who livest.

**Epistle:** *I Corinthians 11: 23-29.* Brethren, I have received of the Lord, that which also I delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread, and giving thanks, broke, and said, Take ye and eat; this is My body which shall be delivered for you; this do for the commemoration of Me. In like manner also the chalice, after He had supped, saying, This chalice is the new testament in My blood; this do ye, as often as you shall drink, for the commemoration of Me. For as often as you shall eat this bread, and drink this chalice, you shall show the death of the Lord until He come. Therefore whosoever shall eat this bread, or drink of the chalice of the Lord unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and of the blood of the Lord. But let a man prove himself; and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of the chalice. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh judgment to himself, not discerning the body of the Lord.

**Gradual:** *Psalm 144: 15, 16.* The eyes of all hope in Thee, O Lord, and Thou givest them meat in due season. *V.* Thou openest Thy hand, and fillest every living creature with Thy blessing. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* *St. John 6: 56, 57.* My flesh is meat indeed, and My blood is drink indeed: He that eateth My flesh and drinketh My blood, abideth in Me, and I in him.

**SEQUENCE (SEE THE BACK OF THE BULLETIN)**

**Gospel:** *St. John 6: 56-59.* At that time, Jesus said to the multitudes of the Jews: My flesh is meat indeed, and My blood is drink indeed. He that eateth My flesh, and drinketh My blood, abideth in Me, and I in him. As the living Father hath sent Me, and I live by the Father, so he that eateth Me, the same also shall live by Me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Not as your fathers did eat manna and are dead. He that eateth this bread shall live for ever.

**Offertory:** *Leviticus 21: 6.* The priests of the Lord offer incense and loaves to God, and therefore they shall be holy to their God, and shall not defile His name. Alleluia.

**Secret:** Of Thy goodness, we beseech Thee, O Lord, grant to Thy Church the gifts of unity and peace which are mystically represented under the gifts we offer. Through our Lord.

**Preface of the Nativity:** It is truly meet and just, right and availing unto salvation, that we should in all times and in all places give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty and everlasting God. Because by the mystery of the Word made flesh, the light of Thy glory hath shone anew upon the eyes of our mind: that while we acknowledge Him to be God seen by men, we may be drawn by Him to the love of things unseen. And therefore with angels and archangels, with thrones and dominions, and with all the heavenly hosts, we sing a hymn to Thy glory, saying without ceasing: *Holy, holy, holy . . .*

**Communion:** *I Corinthians 11: 26, 27.* As often as you shall eat this bread, and drink the chalice, you shall show forth the death of the Lord, until He come; therefore whosoever shall eat this bread or drink the chalice of the Lord unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. Alleluia.

**Postcommunion:** Grant us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to be filled with the everlasting enjoyment of Thy divinity, which the temporal partaking of Thy precious body and blood doth foreshow. Who livest.

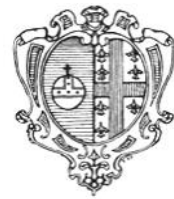
