#### SUNDAY WITHIN THE OCTAVE OF THE ASCENSION

**Introit:** Psalm 26: 7, 8, 9. Hear, O Lord, my voice with which I have cried to Thee, alleluia: my heart hath said to Thee, I have sought Thy face, Thy face, O Lord, I will seek: turn not away Thy face from me, alleluia, alleluia. Ps. 26: 1. The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? Glory be. Hear, O Lord.

**Collect:** Almighty and eternal God, make us ever bear a devout affection toward Thee, and with sincere heart to serve Thy majesty. Through our Lord.

**Epistle:** *I Peter 4: 7-11.* Dearly beloved, be prudent, and watch in prayers. But before all things have a constant mutual charity among yourselves; for charity covereth a multitude of sins. Using hospitality one toward another without murmuring. As every man hath received grace, ministering the same one to another; as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. If any man speak, let him speak as the words of God. If any man minister, let him do it as of the power which God administereth; that in all things God may be honored through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

**Alleluia:** Alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm 46: 9.* The Lord hath reigned over all the nations; God sitteth on His holy throne. Alleluia. *St. John 14: 18.* I will not leave you orphans; I go and I come to you, and your heart shall rejoice. Alleluia.

**Gospel:** St. John 15: 26, 27 & 16: 1-4. At that time, Jesus said to His disciples, When the Paraclete cometh, Whom I will send you from the Father, the Spirit of truth, Who proceedeth from the Father, He shall give testimony of Me: and you shall give testimony, because you are with Me from the beginning. These things have I spoken to you, that you may not be scandalized. They will put you out of the synagogues: yea, the hour cometh, that whosoever killeth you will think that he doth a service to God. And these things will they do to you, because they have not known the Father, nor Me. But these things I have told you, that, when the hour shall come, you may remember that I told you.

**Offertory:** Psalm 46: 6. God is ascended with jubilee; and the Lord with the sound of trumpet. Alleluia.

**Secret:** Let this immaculate sacrifice purify us, O Lord, and impart to our souls the vigor of supernal grace. Through our Lord.

**Preface for the Ascension:** It is truly meet and just, right and availing unto salvation, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty and everlasting God; through Christ our Lord. Who after His resurrection appeared and showed Himself to all His disciples; and while they beheld Him, was lifted up into heaven, so that He might make us partakers of His Godhead. And therefore with angels and archangels, with thrones and dominions, and with all the heavenly hosts, we sing a hymn to Thy glory, saying without ceasing: Holy, holy, holy, holy...

**Communion:** *St. John 17: 12, 13, 15.* Father, while I was with them, I kept them whom Thou gavest Me, alleluia; but now I come to Thee; I pray not that Thou shouldst take them out of the world, but that Thou shouldst keep them from evil, alleluia, alleluia.

**Postcommunion:** As we have been filled with heavenly gifts, O Lord, grant, we beseech Thee, that we may constantly persevere in thanksgiving. Through our Lord.

#### THE PILGRIM VIRGIN OF FATIMA STATUE

The Pilgrim Virgin of Fatima is waiting for your family to adopt her for a week or two. One of the most effective means of bringing Our Blessed Mother to the attention of luke-warm Christians is "The Pilgrim Virgin."

This practice originated at Fatima on the 30th anniversary (May 13th, 1947) of Our Lady's first Apparition there. On that date the Bishop of Leiria blessed two statues of Our Lady of Fatima and sent them on distant pilgrimages—one to the Far East, the other to the West. The statues are exact replicas of the official one, which was made according to the instructions of Sr. Lucia, and which is venerated in the Chapel of the Apparitions at Cova da Iria. There is reason to believe that Our Blessed Mother herself inspired this beneficial practice of "The Pilgrim Virgin." It has many times received the blessing and the approval of the Holy Father.

The basic idea of the Pilgrim Virgin is this: Most people are unable to make a pilgrimage to Fatima. Our Lady, with characteristic humility and love, overcomes this difficulty by reversing the process. She becomes the Pilgrim. Instead of your making a pilgrimage to her home at Fatima, she makes a pilgrimage to yours.
