INFANT KING NOVENA

O Divine Infant Jesus, I have recourse to Thee. Please, through Thy Blessed Mother, assist me in this necessity (mention intention here), because I firmly believe that Thy Divinity can help me. I repent sincerely of my sins and I beg Thee, O Good Jesus, to grant me the strength to triumph over them. I resolve never more to offend Thee and I come to offer myself to Thee with the intention of enduring everything rather than to displease Thee. Henceforth, I desire to serve Thee with fidelity and, for the love of Thee, O Divine Infant, I will love my neighbor as myself. All powerful Infant, O Jesus, I implore Thee again, assist me in this need. Grant me the grace of possessing Thee eternally with Mary and Joseph and of adoring Thee with the angels in the heavenly court. Amen.

St. Michael the Archangel



THE feast of the Dedication of St. Michael the Archangel (Sept. 29) is the original feast of St. Michael, the leader of the heavenly armies. As captain of these armies, he is often named at Holy Mass and has held a first place among the other angels in the Sacred Liturgy.

St. Michael waged battle and cast the evil spirit out of heaven, but he overcame Satan again in the struggle for possession of the body of Moses.

God has entrusted our defense, in the combat with the devil, to His holy angels.

The devil, as a fallen angel, is a pure spirit who has lost none of the powers inherent to his nature. In order that the struggle should not be unequal, God has placed at our side defenders of the same nature as Lucifer and his cohorts, those angels who are pure spirits though with greater powers than he, so that we may not perish in the day of God's judgment. When a Christian dies, the Church prays that God's standard-bearer, Michael, may lead him into heaven, and so he is often represented bearing the scales of Divine Justice in which each soul are weighed.

St. Michael also oversees our worship of God, for he is the angel whom St. John the evangelist saw in heaven near God's altar, a golden thurible in his hand, offering the fragrant incense of the prayers of the saints. St. Michael is also revered in Catholic tradition and liturgy as the protector of the Church, just as he was once regarded as the protector of the Israelites. He is the special patron of the sick, of mariners and grocers. The name Michael is a variation of Micah, meaning in Hebrew, "Who is like God?"

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



Introit. Ps. 85, 3, 5. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I have cried to Thee all the day; for Thou, O Lord, art sweet and mild, and plenteous in mercy to all that call upon Thee. Ps. 85, 1. Bow down Thy ear to me, O Lord, and hear me; for I am needy and poor. V. Glory.

Prayers. Let Thy grace, we beseech Thee, O Lord, ever go before us and follow us, and may it make us to be continually zealous in doing good works. Through our Lord.

Epistle. Eph. 3, 13-21. Brethren, I pray you not to faint at my tribulations for you, which are your glory. For this cause I bow my knees to the Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ, of Whom all paternity, in heaven and earth is named, that He would grant you, according to the riches of His Spirit with might unto the inward man. That Christ may dwell by faith in your hearts; that being rooted and founded in charity, you may be able to comprehend with all the saints, what is the breadth, and length, and height, and depth. To know also the charity of Christ, which surpasseth all knowledge; that you may be filled unto all the fullness of God. Now to Him Who is able to do all things more abundantly than we desire or understand, according to the power that worketh in us: to Him be glory in the Church, and in Christ Jesus, unto all generations, world without end. Amen.

Gradual. Ps. 101, 16,17. The gentiles shall fear Thy name, O Lord, and all the kings of the earth Thy glory. V. For the Lord hath built up Sion, and He shall be seen in His majesty.

Alleluia, alleluia. V. Ps. 97,1 Sing ye to the Lord a new canticle, because the Lord hath done wonderful things. Alleluia.

Gospel. Luke 14, 1-11. At that time, when Jesus went into the house of one of the chief of the pharisees on the Sabbath day to eat bread, they watched Him. And behold, there was

a certain man before Him that had the dropsy: and Jesus answering, spoke to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying, Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath day? But they held their peace: but He taking him, healed him, and sent him away. And answering them, He said, Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fall into a pit, and will not immediately draw him out on the Sabbath day? And they could not answer Him these things. And He spoke a parable also to them that were invited, marking how they chose the first seats at the table, saying to them, When thou art invited to a wedding, sit not down in the first place, lest perhaps one more honorable than thou be invited by him; and he that invited thee and him, come and say to thee, Give this man place; and then thou begin with shame to take the lowest place. But when thou art invited, go sit down in the lowest place: that when he who inviteth thee cometh, he may say to thee, Friend, go up higher: then shalt thou have glory before them that sit at table with thee: because every one that exalteth himself shall be humbled, and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

Offertory. Ps. 39, 14, 15. Look down, O Lord, to help me; let them be confounded and ashamed that seek after my soul to take it away; look down, O Lord, to help me.

Secret. Cleanse us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, by the effect of the present sacrifice, and in Thy mercy bring to pass in us that we may deserve to be partakers of it. Through our Lord.

Communion. Ps. 70, 16, 17, 18. O Lord, I will be mindful of Thy justice alone: Thou hast taught me, O God, from my youth, and unto old age and gray hairs, O God, forsake me not.

Postcommunion. In Thy loving kindness, purify our souls, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and renew them with the heavenly sacrament, that we may receive bodily assistance thereby, both for this life and for the life to come. Through our Lord.

Honor your Guardian Angel

Choose one day of each month to honor your own good Angel Guardian; receive Holy Communion in his honor on that day, and having employed at least one quarter-of-an-hour after Communion in thanksgiving, reflect upon the great goodness of God, Whom you possess within you, Who, knowing your weakness and the dangers to which you are exposed both in soul and body, and the difficulty you have of defending yourself against your enemies, has appointed over you one of His Angels, who are the princes of His Heavenly Court, and has given him orders to assist and defend you, and never to leave you as long as your soul dwells in your body.



Return to His Divine Majesty most humble thanks for so great a favor, and admire the value He sets on your soul since He thus employs an angel in your service. Then with much piety address yourself to your own dear Angel Guardian, thanking him for accepting the care of you and offer your pledge to be always attentive and faithful to his angelic guiding voice until at last you meet face to face in our true home of eternal bliss.
